GIARDIASIS



Case Definition

Confirmed Case:

Laboratory confirmation of infection with or without clinical evidence from an appropriate clinical specimen (e.g., stool, intestinal fluid, small bowel biopsy), with demonstration of:

- Giardia lamblia spp. oocysts;
- or
- Giardia lamblia spp. nucleic acid (e.g., by polymerase chain reaction (PCR) or other nucleic acid test (NAT))
- · Giardia lamblia antigen (e.g., by an immunologic assay).

Probable Case:

Clinical evidence in a person who is epidemiologically linked to a confirmed case.

Clinical Evidence

Clinical evidence may be characterized by the following signs or symptoms: diarrhea, abdominal pain, nausea, bloating, weight loss, fatigue, gas, dehydration, and/or malabsorption. The severity of illness may vary. Asymptomatic infections may occur.

Reporting Requirements

• Report confirmed and probable cases to DHW Surveillance via Panorama.
