1. Policy

- 1.1 When a young person receives a
 - 1.1.1 Custody and Supervision Order, Nova Scotia Youth Centre (NSYC) staff will forward Canadian Police Information Centre (CPIC) Information (form 3.07.01-A) to the appropriate police agency
 - 1.1.2 Deferred Custody and Supervision Order or Conditional Supervision Order, the Probation Officer (PO) will forward CPIC Information (form 3.07.01-A) to the appropriate police agency
- 1.2 The NSYC will provide notification (form <u>3.07.01-A</u>) to the appropriate police agency when a situation occurs during the administration of a youth sentence that impacts an existing order as a result of a
 - 1.2.1 subsequent youth custody sentence
 - 1.2.2 breach of a custody and supervision, deferred or conditional supervision order
 - 1.2.3 deferred or delayed order start date
 - 1.2.4 youth sentence converted to an adult sentence
- 1.3 The assigned probation officer will provide notification (form <u>3.07.01-A</u>) to the appropriate police agency when
 - 1.3.1 additional conditions set by the provincial director
 - 1.3.2 the start date of a probation order is deferred as a result of subsequent sentence that impacts the current supervision term

2. Responsibility

2.1 The superintendent will designate the staff position responsible to communicate information to the appropriate police agency with information regarding the administration of a youth sentence that impacts an existing order.

3. Notification Process

3.1 The designated NSYC staff person or probation officer will place a copy of the CPIC Information Regarding Youth Orders Form (3.07.01-A) on the young person's file and upload to JEIN.
