Dear Mr. O'Brien:

The Town of Trenton notes the "Request for Submissions" which recently appeared in The Chronicle-Herald requesting views regarding the Freedom of Information & Protection of Privacy Act. The Council of the Town of Trenton submits the following observations and/or recommendations for the Review Committee:

42 -

Section 471(7) of the Act states "On request of the applicant, the responsible officer may
excuse an applicant from paying all or part of a fee referred to in subsection (2) if, in the
opinion of the responsible officer, the applicant cannot afford the payment or for any other
reason it is fair to excuse payment."

If a municipal unit does not excuse fees on principle, i.e., all information requests will be subject to the prescribed fee, but an individual makes the request on their application, the municipality should be granted the right to request an income statement of the individual.

The number of information requests from an individual should be limited especially for those
municipal units with a limited number of staff. For example, in the Town of Trenton, the
administrative staff consists of three (3) members. When continuous FOIPOP requests are
made by the same individual, the amount of time taken away from "regular" Town operations
is substantial.
