1) Minutes of the Previous Meeting

• The minutes of May 1, 2003 were approved and will be posted on the Advisory Committee location on the N.S. Justice Web Site.

2) Re: Oral Submissions Heard on May 8, 2003 and May 14, 2003

- There was considerable discussion on the following topics:
 - What is considered as a reasonable fee.
 - How to improve the process for all parties.
 - Communication Director as a FOIPOP administrator.
- It was noted that all submissions except for the Capital District Health Authority recommended fee reduction.
- It was agreed the committee should look at:
 - Review Office's potential role in determining frivolous and vexatious requests.
 - Requests of previously disclosed records .
- Other issues noted included:
 - Confidentiality issues emphasized in Dalhousie University's submission.
 - Representation from Michelin re: 3rd party notice .
 - Request for an oral submission from Elaine Gibson of Dalhousie University

3) Future Consultations

• Four additional meetings will be scheduled during the summer, two in July (July 15th and July 29th) and two in August (dates will be set at the July 29th meeting).

4) Summer meeting schedule and topics to be covered at each meeting

- Topics to be covered during the July 15th meeting include:
 - Fees, improving the application process, and frivolous and vexatious requests.
- Topics to be covered during the July 29th meeting include:
 - Reviewing list of issues that have emerged and decide on what issues to pursue, and reviewing the three recent reviews on the legislation.
- Conference calls with the Information and Privacy Offices in British Columbia, Ontario and Canada will be discussed at the next meeting.

5) Other Business

- It was requested that the committee be provided with: a copy of how fees and vexatious requests are handled in other jurisdictions; and the three recent reviews (Alberta, British Columbia, and Federal) on the legislation.
- The committee will explore conference calls with the Information and Privacy Offices in British Columbia and Ontario.
- The Province was to be notified that if it wished to make an oral submission in addition to a written submission it would have to be made on June 18th. [Note: a written submission was filed by Provincial FOIPOP Administrators but there was no request to make an oral submission.]
- It was agreed that a summary of points made in the written submission should be prepared
