Next Breakfast Meeting

On **Wednesday December 4th**, Nancy Tram, Manager of Labour Monility Projects with Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials (CICIC – http://cicic.ca) will be at our breakfast meeting to give an update on Building Bridges: Consistency, Portability and Capacity of International Academic Credential Assessment in Canada. This session will provide an overview of the work undertaken by the CICIC in the field of international academic credential assessment.

Since 2007, CICIC has been working on a multi-phase project developing a number of reference tools to support assessors in their evaluation of international academic credentials and to facilitate the integration of internationally trained newcomers in the labour market. These include a Pan-Canadian Quality Assurance Framework for the Assessment of International Academic Credentials (QAF), Terminology Guides, and a Competency Profile for an Academic Credential Assessor. The session will focus on the QAF, an important tool to support you in your work assessing the academic credentials of internationally-trained professionals and in meeting obligations under the Fair Registration Practices Act. It will also provide an update on the next phase of the project and the initiatives CICIC is working on.
