Nova Scotia COVID-19 Supplier Attestation

February 7, 2022

Suppliers providing goods and/or services to the Province are required to ensure their personnel, including any sub-contractors, who are entering any provincial workplace or physically interacting with provincial employees or the public on the Province's behalf are fully vaccinated as of February 9th, 2022.

No supplier attestation form is needed if:

- 1. A supplier is solely providing goods;
- 2. A supplier is providing only virtual services with no requirement to interact in person with provincial employees or the public on the Province's behalf;
- 3. A supplier performs work outside of provincial workplaces and is not interacting with provincial employees or the public on the Province's behalf (e.g. some highway work and some park maintenance); or
- 4. A supplier is only accessing common areas of provincial workplaces, accessible to the public (e.g. courier and delivery services, catering services, etc.).

This supplier attestation form must be completed by an authorized representative of the supplier. Only one attestation form is required per supplier to address all contracts with the Province.

Suppliers who do not comply with the supplier attestation form, or who submit false or misleading information, may be subject to measures up to and including contract termination.

Do NOT provide personal health information. No personal health information of supplier employees will be collected

Attestation (select one)

All personnel who physically interact with the provincial government or the public on the Province's behalf are fully vaccinated.

All personnel who physically interact with the provincial government or the public on the Province's behalf are fully vaccinated or will be by February 9, 2022.

One or more of my personnel have a documented medical exception. All other personnel who physically interact with the provincial government or the public on the Province's behalf are fully vaccinated or will be by February 9, 2022.

Important: In order to receive a medical exception, an individual must have a valid medical contraindication and a letter from a licensed healthcare provider such as a physician or nurse practitioner.

The supplier must contact the contract manager where the medical exception applies immediately, to request an accommodation and recommend additional protective measures. The supplier attestation form will only be considered complete once mitigation measures have been approved by the contract manager, if required.

One or more of the personnel who interact with the Provincial government are not fully vaccinated and do not intend to become vaccinated.

Important: Please be aware that by attesting that one or more personnel who interact with the provincial government are not fully vaccinated and do not intend to become vaccinated, the supplier may be unable to fulfill the duties of their contract(s) and that it may be grounds for contract termination. If this applies to you please contact your contract manager immediately.

Confirm and Agree

I confirm that personnel provided by the supplier have been notified that they are expected to continue to comply with health and safety measures, including but not limited to wearing a mask, using provided PPE, maintaining appropriate physical distancing and self-monitoring of potential COVID-19 symptoms when working on behalf of the Province.

I confirm that personnel provided by the supplier who are unable to be either partially vaccinated or fully vaccinated due to an approved and valid medical exception MAY be subject to additional protective measures presented to and approved by the contract manager where the medical exception applies.

I confirm that all personnel provided by the supplier have been notified of the COVID-19 vaccination requirements of the Province, and that the supplier has complied with this requirement.

I confirm that personnel provided by the supplier coming into provincial workplaces have been requested to carry their proof of vaccination at all times to avoid possible removal from a provincial workplace.

I understand that the Province will declare a supplier unable to fulfill their contract if an attestation is found to be untrue. The Province reserves the right to ask for additional information to verify vaccination status. Failure to comply with any request or requirement imposed by the Province will be considered not fulfilling the duties required under all applicable contracts.

I confirm that the information provided is true and will continue to be true for the duration of all contracts.

Please remember.

- Suppliers coming into provincial workplaces must be able to provide proof of vaccination upon request from the contract manager or front desk reception.
- Suppliers are requested to carry their proof of vaccination at all times to avoid possible removal from a workplace.
- We will periodically monitor adherence to the proof of vaccination protocol for suppliers by requesting to see proof of vaccination.
- Many suppliers may be asked to show proof of vaccination to enter provincial facilities in
 the same way our visitors are being asked. In the event there are compliance issues with this
 protocol, contract termination may be considered. We will make every attempt to work with
 suppliers on accommodation requests as part of our relationship with industry.

The Province is committed to protecting the personal information it collects regarding the vaccination status of its suppliers. All information collected pursuant to the Requirement will be held in strict confidence and used or disclosed only for the specific purposes described in the Requirement and in accordance with the FOIPOP Act.
