When can I get my vaccines?

Every year in the fall vaccines become available.



How can I get a vaccine appointment?

How can I get a vaccine appointment for my child?

Parents/guardians can book their child's influenza and COVID-19 vaccine appointments through the same channels they book their own.



Can I get both vaccines at the same time?

Yes! It's encouraged and more convenient.



How do I upload information for the vaccines I received outside of Nova Scotia?

Nova Scotians can add COVID-19 vaccines that they received outside the province to their Nova Scotia proof of vaccination. Updates can be made online: <https://vaccineentryservice.novascotia.ca/>.



Can I get vaccinated if I don't have a health card?

Yes! If you don't have a valid Nova Scotia Health Card, call 1-833-797-7772 to book your appointment.



What vaccines do I need to get?

It is recommended everyone 6 months and older get their COVID-19 and flu vaccines.

People 65 years and older should receive the enhanced seniors influenza vaccine because it works better in older adults. For people younger than 65, a standard dose vaccine will provide you with good protection.
