# **IN SUMMARY...**

Ac	tivity levels**
٠	Zone 3 is reporting localized activity. Zones 1, 2 and 4 are reporting no activity.
Lal	boratory-confirmed cases***
•	There was 1 influenza case reported during this week. There have been 20 lab confirmed cases of Influenza reported during the 2016-2017 influenza season. Positive test results were received for mycoplasma pneumoniae and RSV.
Sev	verity
•	There have been 2 ICU admissions and 3 deaths*** of laboratory confirmed influenza during the 2016-2017 influenza season.
Sy	ndromic surveillance
•	The average ILI rate for Nova Scotia during this reporting period was 0.9. 100% of emergency rooms reported ILI data during this reporting period.

**Notes:** \*Reporting weeks run from Sunday to Saturday. The 2016-2017 influenza season is defined using PHAC's influenza surveillance weeks. This year runs from August 28, 2016 (Week 35) to August 26, 2017 (Week 34);

\*\*Activity level data is obtained from CNPHI, see appendix for definitions;

\*\*\*Deaths include individuals with a positive influenza test result, influenza may not have been the major contributing cause of death or hospitalization.







#### **ILI CASE DEFINITION**

Acute onset of respiratory illness with fever and cough and with one or more of the following – sore throat, arthralgia, myalgia or prostration which is likely due to influenza. In children under 5, gastrointestinal symptoms may also be present. In patients under 5 or 65 and older, fever may not be prominent.

#### MANAGEMENT ZONES

Zone 1 – Western Zone 2 – Northern Zone – Eastern Zone 4 - Central
