Order in Council 1999-264 made May 26, 1999
Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council
pursuant to Section 33
of the *Embalmers and Funeral Directors Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Business and Consumer Services dated May 5, 1999, pursuant to Section 33 of Chapter 144 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Embalmers and Funeral Directors Act*, is pleased to amend the regulations respecting embalmers and funeral directors made by Order in Council 83-1131 dated October 4, 1983, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on, from and after May 26, 1999.

**Amendments to the regulations respecting embalmers and funeral directors
made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 33 of Chapter 144
of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,
the *Embalmers and Funeral Directors Act***

- 1 Subsection 3(5) of the regulations respecting embalmers and funeral directors made by Order in Council 83-1131 dated October 4, 1983, is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
 - (5) An applicant who holds or held within the last 24 months a funeral director's licence issued by another jurisdiction shall
 - (a) provide proof of the licence;
 - (b) pay the licence fee; and
 - (c) pass an examination set by the Board on Nova Scotia legislation relating to the performance of funeral services, the burial, cremation or other disposition of human remains and the sale of pre-arranged funeral plansbefore being issued a funeral director's licence.
- 2 Subsection 12B(1) of the regulations is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
 - (1) An applicant who holds an embalmer's licence issued by another jurisdiction within the previous 24 months shall
 - (a) provide proof of the embalmer's licence; and

(b) pay the prescribed licence fee
before being issued an embalmer's licence.

3 Subsection 13(1) of the regulations is amended by adding the following clause immediately after clause (c):

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Education and Culture dated May 5, 1999, pursuant to Section 146 of Chapter 1 of the Acts of 1995-96, the *Education Act*, is pleased to amend the Governor in Council Education Act Regulations made by Order in Council 97-405 dated June 24, 1997, in the manner attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation as Appendix "A", and respecting 1997-98 fiscal year.

APPENDIX "A"

**Amendments to the *Governor in Council Education Act Regulations*
made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 146
of Chapter 1 of the Acts of 1995-96, the *Education Act***

- 1 Subsection 8(5) of the *Governor in Council Education Act Regulations* made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 97-405 dated June 24, 1997, is amended, effective April 1, 1997, by
 - (a) striking out "and" in clause (a);
 - (b) striking out the period at the end of clause (b) and substituting "; and";
 - (c) adding the following clause immediately after clause (b):
 - (c) a learning disabilities grant.

- 2 Effective April 1, 1997, Schedule "A" of the regulations is repealed and the following Schedule "A" is substituted:
 - 1 (1) In this Schedule,
 - (a) "funding enrolment" means the total enrolment at all levels in the schools of the school board on September 30 of the year immediately preceding the funding year;
 - (b) "funding year" means the school board fiscal year for which the Minister's contribution is to be determined;
 - (c) "regulations" means the *Governor in Council Education Act Regulations*;

- (d) "textbook credit allocation" means the amount of credit with the Nova Scotia School Book Bureau assigned by the Minister to a school board in accordance with Section 13 of the *Ministerial Education Act Regulations*;
- (2) Despite clause (1)(b), the following shall not be counted in the funding enrolment of a school board without the permission of the Minister:
- (a) students who are not within the age range for which the right to attend public school is provided pursuant to subsection 5(2) of the Act;
- (b) students for whom the school board receives funding from a source other than the Province or a municipality.
- 2 The general formula grant referred to in clause 8(3)(a) of the regulations is equal to the funding enrolment of the school board multiplied by \$3460.41 less the amount that would be raised by a tax at the rate of 39 cents per \$100 of the uniform assessment of the municipalities served by the school board, determined pursuant to the *Municipal Grants Act*.
- 3 The student transportation operating grant referred to in clause 8(3)(b) of the regulations is equal to \$36 900 multiplied by the number, as determined by the Minister, of approved buses on regular runs as of September 30, 1995.
- 4 The specific purpose grant referred to in clause 8(5)(a) of the regulations shall be a special education grant in an amount that is the lesser of
- (a) the product of the school board's funding enrolment multiplied by \$243.90; and
- (b) the actual cost of special education programs provided by the school board and approved by the Minister.
- 5 The specific purpose grant referred to in clause 8(5)(c) of the regulations shall be a learning disabilities grant in an amount that is the lesser of
- (a) the product of the school board's funding enrolment multiplied by \$8.10; and
- (b) the actual cost of special education programs provided by the school board and approved by the Minister.
- 6 (1) The capital bus replacement grant referred to in clause 8(1)(c) of the regulations shall be the product of \$4200 multiplied by the number, as determined by the Minister, of approved buses used by the school board for regular student transportation, including those that are used by the school board as approved spare buses, with the provision that

the grant shall be used only for bus replacement or for capital equipment or repair and renovation expenditures as described in subsection 8(7) of the regulations.

- (2) A school board may incur expenditures for a purpose set out in subsection 8(7) of the regulations provided that the school board shall obtain the prior written approval of the Minister for any item requiring the expenditure of an amount in excess of \$200 000 or for expenditures to cover the cost of school bus purchases.
 - (3) Subject to the approval of the Minister, a school board may use a portion of the general formula or capital bus replacement grant for the purpose of repaying debts incurred to cover the cost of capital projects approved by the Minister, including extensive renovations to individual school buildings, and the construction of new buildings or additions to existing buildings used for school purposes.
 - (4) At the end of the fiscal year for which a school board's capital bus replacement grant has been provided, any portion of the grant that has not been spent for purposes authorized under this Section shall be held in reserve by the school board and shall be used in future years solely for approved capital equipment, repair and renovation or capital bus replacement expenditures.
- 7 The equity grant referred to in clause 8(3)(c) of the regulations shall be provided in the 1997-98 fiscal year to
- (a) the Cape Breton-Victoria Regional School Board, calculated at \$5190.62 multiplied by the actual eligible vocational student enrolment at Memorial High School as of September 30, 1996, plus \$500,000;
 - (b) the Strait Regional School Board, calculated at \$346.04 multiplied by the funding enrolment of the Strait Regional School Board as of September 30, 1996, plus \$750,000; and
 - (c) the Conseil scolaire acadien provincial, calculated at \$692.08 multiplied by the actual eligible funding enrolment of the Conseil as of September 30, 1996.
- 8 The Provincial contribution grant in respect of the teacher early retirement plan referred to in clause 8(5)(b) of the regulations is equal to 100% of the school board's 1997-98 contribution towards the teacher early retirement plan liabilities as set out in the Minister's statement made pursuant to Section 73 of the Act.

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Education and Culture dated May 5, 1999, pursuant to Section 146 of Chapter 1 of the Acts of 1995-96, the *Education Act*, is pleased to amend the Governor in Council Education Act Regulations made by Order in Council 97-405 dated June 24, 1997, in the manner attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation as Appendix "A", and respecting the 1998-99 fiscal year.

APPENDIX "A"

**Amendments to the *Governor in Council Education Act Regulations*
made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 146
of Chapter 1 of the Acts of 1995-96, the *Education Act***

- 1 Subsection 8(3) of the *Governor in Council Education Act Regulations* made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 97-405 dated June 24, 1997, is amended, effective April 1, 1998, by
 - (a) striking out "and" in clause (b);
 - (b) striking out the period at the end of clause (c); and
 - (c) adding the following clauses after clause (c):
 - (d) an additional base line grant; and
 - (e) an additional formula grant.

- 2 Subsection 8(5) of the regulations is amended, effective April 1, 1998, by
 - (a) repealing clause (b);
 - (b) relettering clause (c) as (b);
 - (c) striking out the period at the end of clause (b) and substituting a semicolon; and
 - (d) adding the following clauses immediately after clause (b):
 - (c) a deficit assistance grant; and
 - (d) a salary increase grant.

- 3 Effective April 1, 1998, Schedule “A” of the regulations is repealed and the following Schedule “A” is substituted:
- 1 (1) In this Schedule,
- (a) “funding enrolment” means the total enrolment at all levels in the schools of the school board on September 30 of the year immediately preceding the funding year;
 - (b) “funding year” means the school board fiscal year for which the Minister’s contribution is to be determined;
 - (c) “previous year’s funding enrolment” means the total enrolment at all levels in the schools of the school board on September 30 of the year immediately preceding the year used to determine the funding enrolment.
 - (d) “regulations” means the *Governor in Council Education Act Regulations*;
 - (e) “textbook credit allocation” means the amount of credit with the Nova Scotia School Book Bureau assigned by the Minister to a school board in accordance with Section 13 of the *Ministerial Education Act Regulations*;
- (2) Despite clause (1)(b), the following shall not be counted in the funding enrolment or the previous year’s funding enrolment of a school board without the permission of the Minister:
- (a) students who are not within the age range for which the right to attend public school is provided pursuant to subsection 5(2) of the Act;
 - (b) students for whom the school board receives funding from a source other than the Province or a municipality.
- 2 The general formula grant referred to in clause 8(3)(a) of the regulations is equal to the funding enrolment of the school board multiplied by \$3460.41 less the amount that would be raised by a tax at the rate of 37.96 cents per \$100 of the uniform assessment of the municipalities served by the school board, determined pursuant to the *Municipal Grants Act*.
- 3 The student transportation operating grant referred to in clause 8(3)(b) of the regulations is equal to \$36 900 multiplied by the number, as determined by the Minister, of approved buses on regular runs as of September 30, 1995.
- 4 The specific purpose grant referred to in clause 8(5)(a) of the regulations shall be a special education grant in an amount that is the lesser of

- (a) the product of the school board's previous year's funding enrolment multiplied by \$243.90; and
 - (b) the actual cost of special education programs provided by the school board and approved by the Minister.
- 5 The specific purpose grant referred to in clause 8(5)(c) of the regulations shall be a learning disabilities grant in an amount that is the lesser of
 - (a) the product of the school board's previous year's funding enrolment multiplied by \$8.10; and
 - (b) the actual cost of special education programs provided by the school board and approved by the Minister.
- 6
 - (1) The capital bus replacement grant referred to in clause 8(1)(c) of the regulations shall be the product of \$4200 multiplied by the number, as determined by the Minister, of approved buses used by the school board for regular student transportation, including those that are used by the school board as approved spare buses, with the provision that the grant shall be used only for bus replacement or for capital equipment or repair and renovation expenditures as described in subsection 8(7) of the regulations.
 - (2) A school board may incur expenditures for a purpose set out in subsection 8(7) of the regulations provided that the school board shall obtain the prior written approval of the Minister for any item requiring the expenditure of an amount in excess of \$200 000 or for expenditures to cover the cost of school bus purchases.
 - (3) Subject to the approval of the Minister, a school board may use a portion of the general formula or capital bus replacement grant for the purpose of repaying debts incurred to cover the cost of capital projects approved by the Minister, including extensive renovations to individual school buildings, and the construction of new buildings or additions to existing buildings used for school purposes.
 - (4) At the end of the fiscal year for which a school board's capital bus replacement grant has been provided, any portion of the grant that has not been spent for purposes authorized under this Section shall be held in reserve by the school board and shall be used in future years solely for approved capital equipment, repair and renovation or capital bus replacement expenditures.
- 7 The equity grant referred to in clause 8(3)(c) of the regulations shall be provided in the 1998-99 fiscal year to

- (a) the Cape Breton-Victoria Regional School Board, calculated at \$5190.62 multiplied by the actual eligible vocational student enrolment at Memorial High School as of September 30, 1996, plus \$500,000;
- (b) the Strait Regional School Board, calculated at \$346.04 multiplied by the funding enrolment of the Strait Regional School Board as of September 30, 1996, plus \$750,000; and
- (c) the Conseil scolaire acadien provincial, calculated at \$692.08 multiplied by the actual eligible funding enrolment of the Conseil as of September 30, 1996.

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Natural Resources dated May 12, 1999, pursuant to subsection 113(1) of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act*, is pleased, effective on, from and after July 15, 1999, to:

- (a) amend the *Bear Harvesting Regulations* made by Order in Council 88-349 dated March 29, 1988, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (b) amend the *Deer Hunting Regulations* made by Order in Council 88-348 dated March 29, 1988, in the manner set forth in Schedule "B" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (c) amend the *Deer Registration Station Regulations* made by Order in Council 89-745 dated June 27, 1989, in the manner set forth in Schedule "C" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (d) amend the *Fur Harvesting Regulations* made by Order in Council 87-956 dated August 18, 1987, in the manner set forth in Schedule "D" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (e) amend the *General Wildlife Regulations* made by Order in Council 87-1181 dated September 29, 1987, in the manner set forth in Schedule "E" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (f) amend the *Moose Hunting Regulations* made by Order in Council 88-405 dated April 20, 1988, in the manner set forth in Schedule "F" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (g) amend the *Small Game Hunting Regulations* made by Order in Council 87-957 dated August 18, 1987, in the manner set forth in Schedule "G" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation.

SCHEDULE “A”**Amendments to the *Bear Harvesting Regulations* made by the Governor in Council pursuant to subsection 113(1) of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act***

- 1 Section 2 of the *Bear Harvesting Regulations* made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 88-349 on March 29, 1988, is amended by
 - (a) repealing clause (d) and substituting the following clause:
 - (d) “Bear Hunting Licence” means a valid base licence which has affixed to it a valid Bear Hunting Stamp and a tag;
 - (b) adding the following clauses immediately following clause (d):
 - (da) “Bear Hunting Stamp” means a stamp issued by the Department that, when affixed to a valid base licence, confers on the holder the privilege of hunting bear with a firearm or bow in accordance with the Act and regulations;
 - (db) “Bear Snaring Stamp” means a stamp issued by the Department that, when affixed to a valid base licence, confers on the holder the privilege of snaring bear in accordance with the Act and regulations;
 - (c) repealing clause (i) and substituting the following clause:
 - (i) “Resident Bear Snaring Licence” means a valid base licence which has affixed to it a valid Bear Snaring Stamp and a tag.
- 2 (1) Subsection 3(1) of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) striking out “licence” and substituting “stamp”; and
 - (b) striking out “Licence” wherever it appears in clauses (a), (b) and (c), and substituting “Stamp”.
 - (2) Subsection 3(2) of the regulations is repealed and subsection 3(1) renumbered as Section 3.
- 3 (1) Clause 9(1)(b) of the regulations is amended by striking out “; and” and substituting a period.
 - (2) Clause 9(1)(c) of the regulations is repealed.
 - (3) Subsections 9(2), (4) and (5) of the regulations are repealed and subsection (3) renumbered as (2).

 - (b) re-lettering clause (da) as (db) and adding the following clause immediately following clause (d):
 - (da) “Deer Hunting Stamp” means a stamp issued by the Department that, when affixed to a valid base licence, confers on the holder the privilege of hunting deer in accordance with the Act and regulations;
- 2 (1) Subsection 3(1) of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) striking out “a Deer Hunting Licence in the following forms” and substituting “the following”;
 - (b) striking out “Licence” in clauses (a) and (b) and substituting “Stamp”; and
 - (c) adding the following clause immediately following clause (b):
 - (c) Antlerless Deer Hunting Stamp - \$Nil.
- (2) Subsections 3(2) and 3(3) of the regulations are amended by striking out “Licence” wherever it appears and substituting “Stamp”.
- (3) Subsection 3(4) is repealed.

- 2 (1) Subsections 3(3) and 3(5) of the regulations are amended by striking out “Licence” wherever it appears and substituting “Stamp”.
- (2) Subsection 3(6) of the regulations is repealed.
- 3 Clause 13(a) of the regulations is amended by striking out “attached to a licence” and substituting “required by the Minister”.

SCHEDULE “E”**Amendments to the *General Wildlife Regulations* made by the Governor in Council pursuant to subsection 113(1) of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act***

 - (aa) “base licence” means a licence consisting of a licence card issued by the Department and a current wildlife habitat stamp;

 - (l) “wildlife habitat stamp” means a stamp issued by the Department that, when completed in accordance with the Act and affixed to a licence card, constitutes a base licence.

Other harvestable wildlife

- 3 (1) For purposes of referring to the wildlife described in subsections (2) and (3) in these and other regulations made pursuant to the Act, such wildlife may be identified as "other harvestable wildlife".
- (2) The following other harvestable wildlife may be hunted in accordance with these regulations at the following times of the year:

<u>Species</u>	<u>Open Season</u>
(a) coyote	January 1 to December 31
(b) red squirrel	November 1 to February 28
(c) crow	September 1 to March 31
(d) snapping turtle	July 15 to September 30
(e) bullfrog	July 15 to September 30

- (3) The following other harvestable wildlife may be hunted in accordance with these regulations at any time of the year by the owner or occupier of the property or agent of the owner or occupier for the purpose of preventing damage to property:
- (a) mice and rats;
 - (b) voles, moles and shrews;
 - (c) porcupine;
 - (d) woodchuck (groundhog);
 - (e) red squirrel and chipmunk;
 - (f) coyote;
 - (g) skunk;
 - (h) rock dove (common pigeon);
 - (i) crow;
 - (j) English sparrow;
 - (k) starling.
- (4) Except as otherwise provided in the Act or regulations made pursuant to the Act, it shall be an offence for any person to hunt other harvestable wildlife other than as prescribed in this Section.
- (5) No person shall hunt other harvestable wildlife unless the person is the holder of a valid base licence.
- (6) Subsection (5) does not apply to an owner or occupier or an agent of an owner or occupier hunting other harvestable wildlife in accordance with subsection (3).
- (7) Any person 18 years of age or over may hunt other harvestable wildlife in accordance with these regulations with a firearm or bow provided the person is the holder of a valid Firearm Hunting Certificate or Bowhunter Hunting Certificate.

- (8) Any person who is not less than 12 years of age or more than 17 years of age may hunt other harvestable wildlife in accordance with these regulations with a firearm or bow provided
- (a) the person possesses a valid Firearm Hunting Certificate or Bowhunter Hunting Certificate issued to the person;
 - (b) the person possesses a minor's permit issued to the person pursuant to the Criminal Code if hunting is done with a firearm;
 - (c) the person is under the immediate supervision of a parent or guardian or any other responsible person 18 years of age or over who possesses a valid Firearm Hunting Certificate if the hunting is done with a firearm or a valid Bowhunter Hunting Certificate if the hunting is done with a bow; and
 - (d) while hunting pursuant to a special coyote hunting permit any rifle used is of a calibre of less than .23.

- 3 The regulations are further amended by adding the following Sections immediately following Section 3:

Base licence

- 3A (1)** A base licence expires on July 14 next following the date the base licence was issued.
- (2) No person less than 12 years of age may obtain a base licence.

Replacement licence

- 3B (1)** Where any licence to take, hunt or kill wildlife issued pursuant to the Act or regulations is lost, destroyed or needs to be replaced for any other reason, the Department may, if satisfied upon receipt of proof of the loss or destruction or need for replacement, issue a replacement licence to the applicant for a fee equal to one-half the total cost of the licence being replaced or \$20.00, whichever is less.
- (2) A replacement licence issued under subsection (1) shall have the same force and effect as if it were the original licence.
- (3) An application for a replacement licence shall be on a form prescribed by the Minister.

- 2 Section 3 of the regulations is amended by striking out “moose hunting licence” wherever it appears and substituting “moose hunting stamp”.
- 3 (1) Subsection 4(2) of the regulations is amended by striking out “licence” and substituting “stamp”.
- (2) Subsection 4(3) of the regulations is amended by striking out “licence” wherever it appears and substituting “stamp”.
- (3) Subsection 4(4) of the regulations is repealed.
- 4 Subsection 5(1) of the regulations is amended by striking out “Any person to whom a valid moose hunting licence is issued” and substituting “The holder of a moose hunting licence”.

 - (b) striking out “Licence” in clauses (a) and (b) and substituting “Stamp”.

- (3) Subsection 3(5) of the regulations is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
