Schedule “A”**Amendment to the *Hatching Egg Farmers of Nova Scotia Regulations*
made by the Hatching Egg Farmers of Nova Scotia pursuant to
Section 9 of Chapter 308 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,
the *Natural Products Act***

- 1 Section 2 of the *Hatching Egg Farmers of Nova Scotia Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 124/2023, made by the Hatching Egg Farmers of Nova Scotia on June 6, 2023, and approved by the Natural Products Marketing

Council on June 20, 2023, is amended by adding the following definitions immediately following the definition of “Act”:

“auditor” means a person who performs audits in accordance with CHEQ and CHEP ACP and is appointed by the Commodity Board to conduct audits in the Province;

“certification agent” means an agent appointed by the Commodity Board for the purpose of recommending to the Commodity Board whether to grant certification to, suspend, or terminate, the certification of a producer as compliant with the requirements of the CHEQ and CHEP ACP;

“CHEP ACP” means the Canadian Hatching Egg Producers Animal Care Program established by the Canadian Hatching Egg Producers, as amended from time to time;

“CHEQ” means the Canadian Hatching Egg Quality Program established by the Canadian Hatching Egg Producers, as amended from time to time;

2 Subsection 5(1) of the regulations is amended by

(a) striking out the “.” in clause (k) and replacing [it] with “;”;

(b) adding the following clause immediately after clause (k):

(l) confirmation that the applicant will participate in, and contribute to, any disease insurance plan required by the Commodity Board.

3 The regulations are further amended by adding the following Sections immediately after Section 10:

Requirement to meet CHEQ and CHEP ACP

11 A registered producer must meet and continue to meet the requirements of CHEQ and CHEP ACP.

CHEQ and CHEP ACP audits

12 (1) A registered producer must arrange for audits to be conducted as required by, and to assess compliance with, CHEQ and CHEP ACP.

(2) An audit under CHEQ and CHEP ACP must be conducted on a date agreed to by the auditor and the producer.

(3) After conducting an audit, the auditor must submit the completed audit report to the certification agent.

(4) After the certification agent receives an audit report, the certification agent must make a recommendation to the Commodity Board whether the producer meets the requirements of CHEQ and CHEP ACP, as applicable.

(5) If the Commodity Board is satisfied, the Commodity Board shall certify a producer as compliant with the requirements of CHEQ and CHEP ACP.

Consequences of failure to meet program requirements

13 If a registered producer fails to meet or continue to meet the requirements of the CHEQ or CHEP ACP, the Commodity Board must revoke the producer’s registration or refuse to issue a registration to the producer until an audit is conducted, and the certification agent recommends to the Commodity Board that the producer meets the requirements of CHEQ and CHEP ACP and the Commodity Board certifies the producer as compliant with the requirements of CHEQ and CHEP

ACP.

Producer responsible for costs

- 14** All costs incurred by a producer in meeting the requirements of CHEQ and CHEP ACP are the responsibility of the producer.

Requirement to participate in disease insurance plan

- 15 (1)** A registered producer must participate in, and contribute to, any disease insurance plan required by the Commodity Board.
- (2)** A registered producer is responsible for its cost of participation in the disease insurance plan.
- (3)** A hatchery must not receive, incubate or hatch hatching eggs from any registered producer who does not hold the disease insurance required by the Commodity Board.

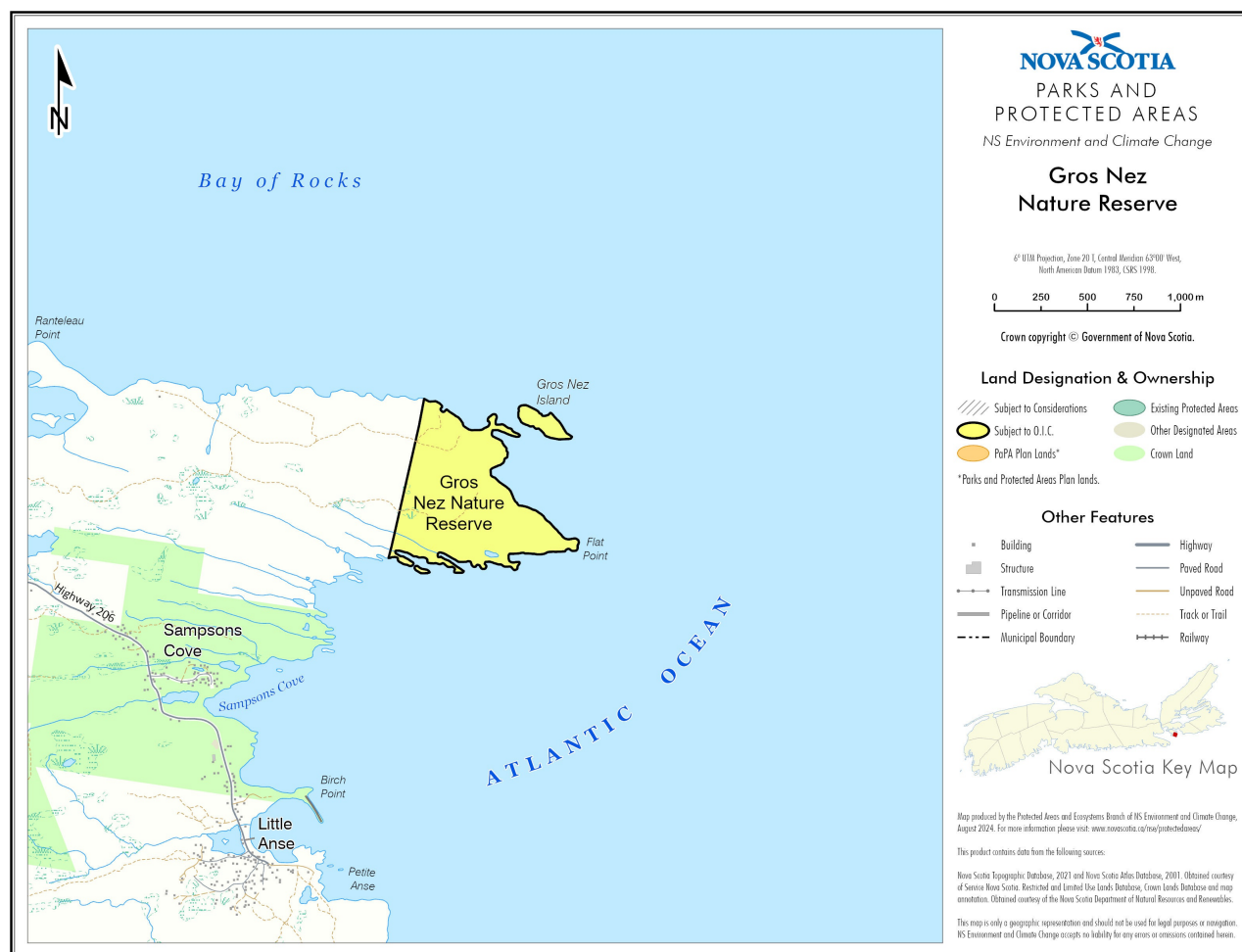

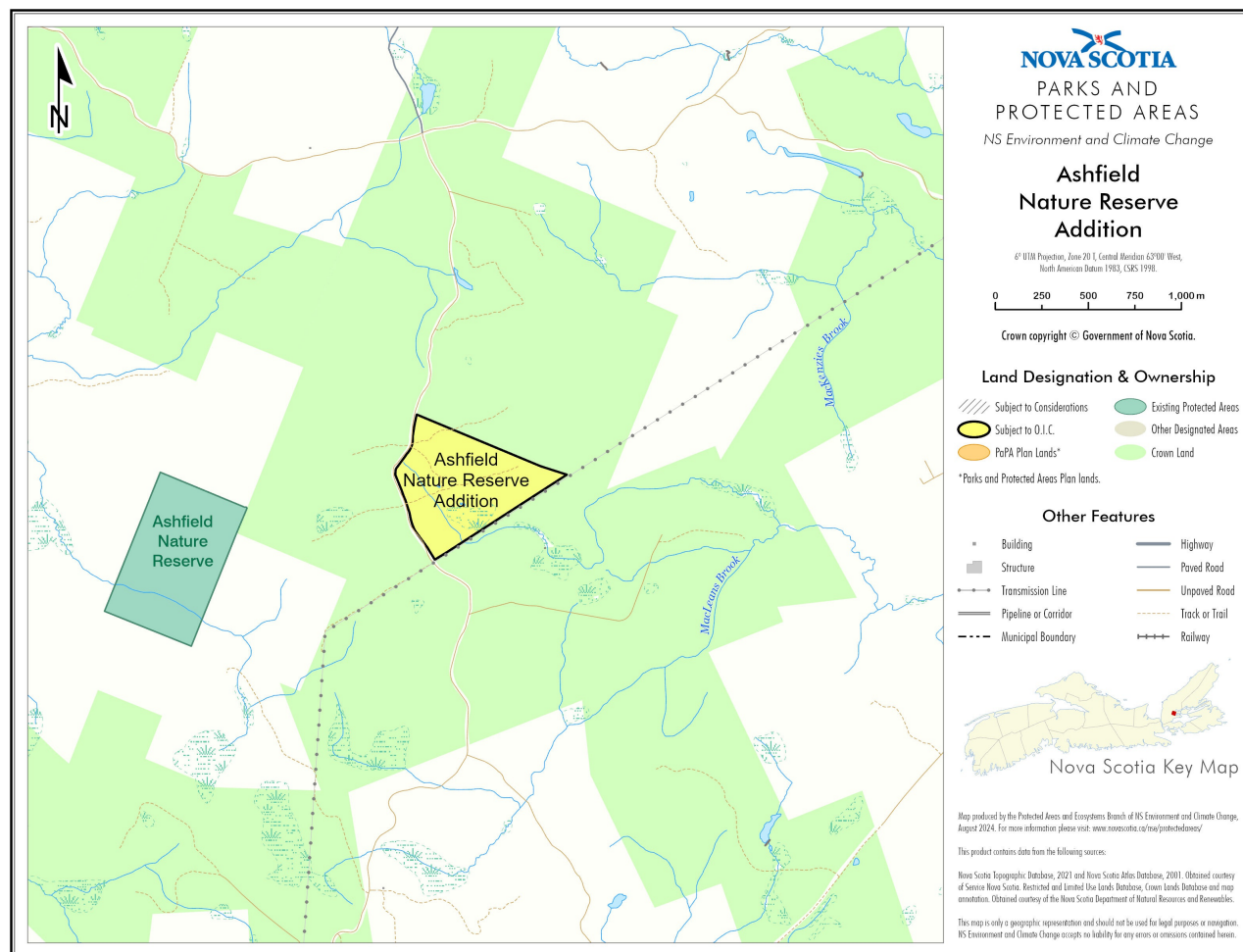

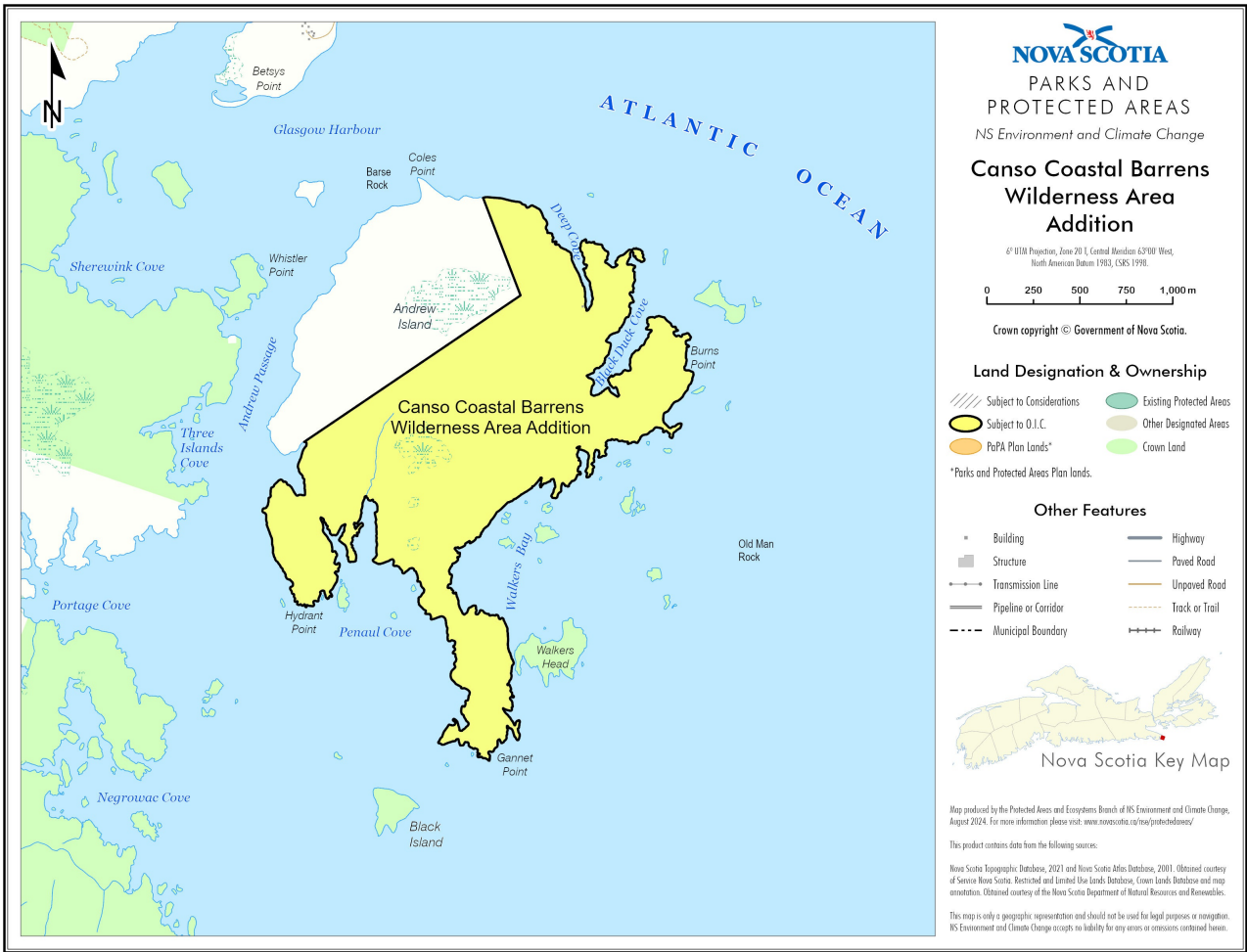

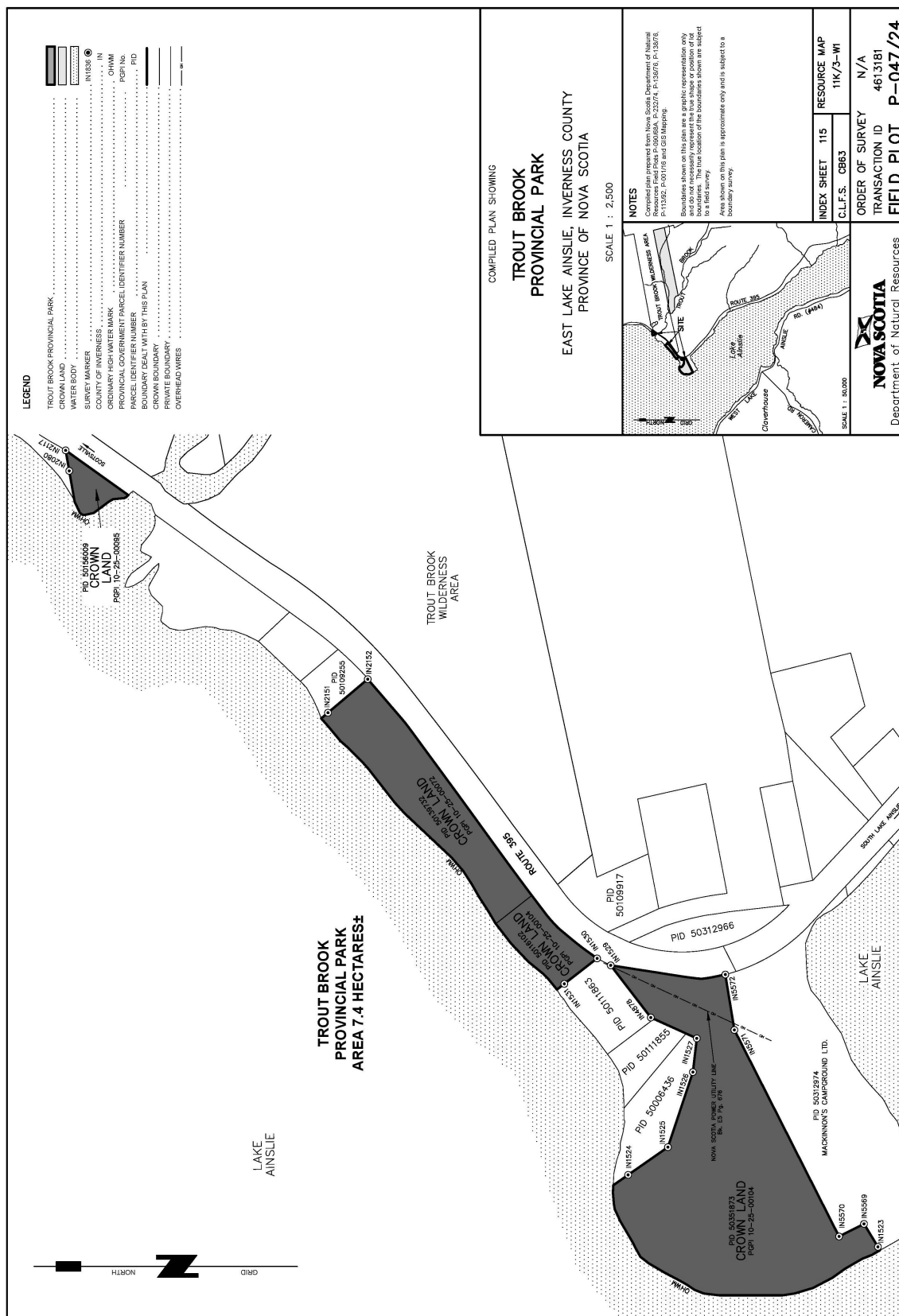
