# Accessibility Directorate Support

The Accessibility Directorate provides a variety of supports to Prescribed Public Sector Bodies (PPSBs), including the following:

- Presentations on topics related to the Accessibility Act
- Training and education
  - Accessibility Foundations' Train the Trainer a program that trains individuals to facilitate an educational workshop called Accessibility Foundations covering basic concepts around disability and accessibility. Participants can then facilitate the Accessibility Foundations workshop for their own PPSB organization or work collaboratively with other trainers on joint facilitation.
  - Virtual Webinars live webinars regularly offered to PPSBs on a variety of accessibility and disability topics, such as social media accessibility, plain language, inclusive employment, emergency management for persons with disabilities, and more.
- Promotional materials to use for accessibility awareness, such as during Access Awareness Week and International Day of Persons with Disabilities.
- Advisory supports, such as answering questions and providing connections to other resources and organizations.

### Municipal Accessibility Equity Anti-Racism Support Program

The Office of Equity and Anti-Racism, the Accessibility Directorate and The Association of Municipal Administrators of Nova Scotia (AMANS) are working together to support municipalities and villages to meet planning requirements under both the Dismantling Racism and Hate Act and the Accessibility Act, improve accessibility and address systemic hate, inequity, and racism across Nova Scotia.

The <u>Municipal Accessibility, Equity, Anti-Racism Support Program</u> was created to help coordinate, promote and provide equity, anti-racism and accessibility capacity-building support for municipalities and villages throughout Nova Scotia. AMANS coordinates the program and offers several resources and initiatives such as workshops, lunch and learns, community of practice, networking opportunities, and training.
