

## Employment and income resources after an emergency

If you have been directly impacted by the wildfires in Nova Scotia, there are some helpful resources to help answer questions you may have about income, employment services, and labour standards.

## Income

The Government of Canada has helpful information for anyone affected by hazardous weather available online <u>Hazardous weather: Important notices - Canada.ca</u>

- If your income has been affected, you may be eligible for Employment Insurance (EI) benefits. Please contact Service Canada to make a claim (<u>https://www.canada.ca/en/services/benefits/ei/ei-regular-benefit/apply.html#h2.02</u>). Service Canada can help you, if you do not have a Record of Employment, have lost other records for an EI claim, or if your employer is unable to provide you with records.
- If you are a current El claim recipient or a beneficiary of the Canada Pension Plan, Canada Pension Plan Disability, or Old Age Security and are concerned about not receiving mail (including paper cheques), you can send in an eServiceCanada request (<u>eServiceCanada - Service Request Form</u>) to make changes to your information.
- To receive Government of Canada payments without delays or interruptions, it is recommended that you sign up for direct deposit <u>Direct deposit for Service Canada</u> <u>- Canada.ca</u>
- Temporary Foreign Workers whose employment has been affected by the wildfires, should contact Service Canada.
