A Coordinated Response to Sexual Violence in Nova Scotia

Hello and happy autumn!

Hope you enjoyed the glorious summer months and that you are settling into the fall groove.

There are a few Strategy updates we want to share with you. First and foremost is the public awareness campaign which was launched on October 4th!

A Provincial Committee on Public Awareness began meeting in June 2015 to assist in the development of a Public Awareness Campaign. The committee was made up of community members and government partners from across the province. We made sure to include youth at many steps along the way, via focus groups and an online survey.

The campaign consists of two short videos featuring bird and bee-type characters animated in the style of popular shows like Bojack Horseman and The Simpsons. The episodes deal with situations of sexual violence that youth told us they're facing in today's world. The first 60 second video takes place at a house party and explores the issue of alcohol and consent. The second video will be launched later this year.

The videos will be available on YouTube, Instagram and Facebook. They'll also be shown in cinemas across the province. The campaign includes a website with useful information on where to get help and how to support a friend who has been subjected to sexual violence.

Youth Engagement

The Strategy provided The Canadian Federation of Students a grant to host a student forum which was held the first weekend of October. Nearly one-hundred students from across the province gathered in Halifax to learn from each other about issues such as anti-oppressive organizing, trauma-informed activism, consent, bystander education and peer-to-peer support. It also provided open organizing space and time to discuss ways to develop on-campus sexual assault policies. It was a venue to "share stories of success and struggle, and ultimately develop a provincial vision to combat sexual violence and rape culture on campus," (CFS, 2016).
