

## Findings and Decision- Assignment Application of Aquaprime Mussel Ranch Limited for AQ#0025

### 1. Overview:

On January 11, 2018 the Nova Scotia Department of Fisheries and Aquaculture (NSDFA) received an assignment application from Aquaprime Mussel Ranch Limited to assign Aquaculture Licence and Lease #0025 (AQ#0025), as described below:

### 2. History

AQ#0025 was first issued to Little Harbour Fisheries on June 19, 1991 for a ten year term (June 19, 1991 to June 19, 2001). AQ#0025 was amended on September 16, 1991 to allow for the cultivation of Giant sea scallops and European oysters. AQ#0025 was assigned on June 17, 1992 from Little Harbour Fisheries to Aquaprime Mussel Ranch Limited. AQ#0025 was renewed on May 2, 2001 for a five year term (June 19, 2001 to June 19, 2006). AQ#0025 was renewed on July 11, 2006 for a five year term (June 19, 2006 to June 19, 2011). AQ#0025 was renewed on November 21, 2011 for a five year term (June 19, 2011 to June 18, 2016). AQ#0025 was renewed on August 2, 2016 for a ten year licence term (June 19, 2016 to June 19, 2026) and a twenty year lease term (June 19, 2016 to June 19, 2036).

### 3. Procedure

#### 3.1 *Performance Review*

A performance review of the information submitted by the operator in support of their assignment application was completed. This review recommended that the site be assigned based on the technical and biological assessment. This performance review is required pursuant to Subsection 72(b) of the Aquaculture Licence and Lease Regulations, and was completed on April 18, 2018.

#### 3.2 *Public Comment Period*

Notice of the application for the assignment of AQ#0025 for the 30-day public comment period was published on NSDFA's website (<http://novascotia.ca/fish/aquaculture/public-information/>) for the period of January 25, 2018 to February 23, 2018. Notice of the application was also published in the Royal Gazette Part I on January 24, 31, and February 7 and 14, 2018.

#### 3.3 *Submissions*

Zero submissions were received by NSDFA during the 30-day public comment period.

### 4. Factors to be considered

AQ#0025 is one of seven shellfish aquaculture sites currently held by Aquaprime Mussel Ranch Limited. Records indicate consistent production and resultant employment. The assignment plan indicates continued contributions to the local economy through a processing and shipping facility. Should the site not be operated as indicated, the Department's site utilization review procedures will be triggered. The

new ownership of Aquaprime Mussel Ranch Limited has experience in shellfish farming and seafood distribution.

The performance review and subsequent public comment period did not note the presence of other fishery activities in the area of the site. There were no ecological concerns identified in the past performance of this site with respect to negative impacts on other fisheries. Records indicate impacts of invasive species and duck predation, with mitigation efforts on-going to address these challenges. AQ#0025 is licensed to cultivate shellfish species, and as such there is no evidence that shellfish aquaculture has impacts on the sustainability of wild salmon. The successful growth of blue mussels in Ship Harbour is proven. The information reviewed during the performance review did not indicate adverse impacts on the surrounding public waters.

There are no recorded instances on file of AQ#0025 interfering with other users of the public waters surrounding the operation. AQ#0025 is authorized to cultivate shellfish using suspended gear, and as such the gear must remain within the geographic boundaries of the site. Section 55 of the *Licence and Lease Regulations* requires an aquaculture licence holder to mark each of their sites in a manner determined by the Minister and keep each site marked during the term of their licence. The operator must also continue to hold approval from Transport Canada as it relates to navigable waters. Also, it is a requirement for the equipment and aquacultural produce to remain within the geographic boundaries of the site.


AQ#0025 is located in the upper region of Ship Harbour and is the furthest aquaculture site into the harbour. It is one of seven sites currently issued in Ship Harbour (all issued to Aquaprime Mussel Ranch Limited). AQ#0025 is located in the nearshore environment, within 40 metres of the shoreline on the northern boundary and within 450 on the western boundary. The physical separation of AQ#0025 from the shoreline and neighbouring aquaculture sites provides for multiple corridors within the harbour. There is no evidence to suggest that the extent of existing aquaculture in the harbour has exceeded the carrying capacity of the harbour.

## 5. Decision

Based on the considerations above, the right, title, and interest of the current ownership of Aquaprime Mussel Ranch Limited in and to Aquaculture Licence #0025 and Aquaculture Lease #0025 is hereby assigned to the prospective ownership of Aquaprime Mussel Ranch Limited. The assignment shall have an effective date of April 26, 2018. The approval documents shall be prepared in accordance with the standard operating documents of NSDFA, and shall be made publically available subject to the provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
