




Aquaculture Site

AQUACULTURE RENEWAL LICENCE FOR 0039 REVISION

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This licence application is to continue utilizing site 0039 for the cultivation of Blue mussel, Sea scallop, America oysters, Bay scallop and European oysters. We have been operating our aquaculture business since 1979. We would like to continue supplying the community with fresh seafood. Also, we take the opportunity to show and educate our customers how we grow and produce our products. Many of our customers have expressed how much they appreciate and enjoy this opportunity. We have mussel sock, pearl net and air hung scallop rope for people to be able to physically see some of the material used in the cultivation of our product.

SECTION 2

2.1 REVISED as per December 15, 2025 request

1. The seed source at this time is collected from old socks that have been harvested which have been left on the lines to collect the mussel spat. Also, mussel spat is collected from main lines, buoys or from market mussel as they are harvested.

Some scallop seeds are collected from the pearl nets that scallops are grown in. Also, the plan is to buy scallop seeds from Arichat harbour when available.

2. The number of lines and approximate length are as per shown on the sketches.

3. Mussel socks are tied at 18-20 inches interval. The number of socks depends on the collection of seed at different times of the year and how bad the tunicate set is at different times of the year.

Scallops grown in nets are hung 2-3 feet apart. Scallops that are air hung are approximately 3-6 feet depending on methods that are working the best at the time they are cleaned, moved or harvested.

4. The proposed number of scallops depends on the available seeds from our site as well as the purchase of approximately 5000 seed from Arichat harbour depending on the spat size.

The number of mussel socks will depend on mussel spat collected and the effect of tunicates and duck issues.

The number of socks or nets on each site depends on the issues involved at the time the socks or nets are cleaned, processed or harvested. In the last several years water temperature can be a determining facture.

5. The plan for both sites 0039 and 0040 is to maintain current production and practices
