### 2. PRESENTATIONS

# 2.1. Housing Acceleration Fund – Proposed Amendments: Kasia Tota, Manager of Community Planning, HRM

- Presentation on changes as presented April 23, 2024 (first reading to Regional Council).
- HRM staff have compiled and summarized feedback and correspondence from engagement period.
- Regional Centre changes include multi-unit zoning and height increases near post-secondary institutions, built-form flexibility, wood construction, and Heritage Conservation Districts.
- Suburban Area changes include allowing up to 4-units on a lot serviced by municipal water and sewer, reduce parking requirements for multi-unit dwellings, and modernized by-laws to streamline approvals for new housing developments.
- Region-wide changes will allow for more flexibility for accessory units and backyard suites, and new accessibility requirements.
- Regulatory capacity through these changes could bring up to 205,000 units to HRM (70,000 in Regional Centre, and 135,000 in Suburban Area).

### 2.2. Panel Discussion

- It was noted that increasing housing density could have impacts on infrastructure transportation networks in some areas and that plans to address will be required.
- Next steps are for Council to decide in the coming weeks before provincial review and approval.
