Order in Council 2005-5 dated January 13, 2005
Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Sections 8A and 8B of the *Summary Proceedings Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Justice dated December 3, 2004, and pursuant to Sections 8A and 8B of Chapter 450 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Summary Proceedings Act*, is pleased to amend the *Summary Offence Tickets Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 4/2001, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2001-21 [dated January 18, 2001,] to provide for parking-infraction tickets in electronic format for the Halifax Regional Municipality in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after January 13, 2005.

Amendments to the Summary Offence Tickets Regulations made pursuant to Sections 8A and 8B of Chapter 450 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989 the Summary Proceedings Act


- 1 The *Summary Offence Tickets Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 4/2001, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2001-21 [dated January 18, 2001,] are amended by adding the following subsection immediately after subsection 11(1):
 - (1A) A parking-infraction ticket in the Halifax Regional Municipality may be in the form set out in Form B-1.
- 2 Section 11 of the regulations is further amended by striking out "subsection (1)" in subsection (2) and substituting "this Section".
- 3 The regulations are further amended by adding the following Section immediately after Section 11:
 - 11A If a parking-infraction ticket or certification that is in an electronic format is completed and signed electronically, the ticket or certification must be completed and signed in an electronic format that is compatible with the Justice Oriented Information System (JOIS) or the Justice Enterprise Information Network (JEIN) or any successor system in use by the Department of Justice, Court Services.
- 4 The regulations are further amended by adding Form B-1, in the form attached, immediately after Form B in Schedule 1 to the regulations.

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Justice and Attorney General dated December 7, 2004, and pursuant to Section 8 of Chapter 450 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia 1989, the *Summary Proceedings Act*, is pleased to amend the *Summary Offence Tickets Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 4/2001, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2001-21 dated January 18, 2001, to include certain offences under the Municipality of the District of Barrington Collection, Storage and Disposal of Waste By-law as summary offence ticket offences and set the out of court settlement amounts for the offences in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after January 13, 2005.

- (a) Chapter 24 of the Acts of 2004, the *Agriculture Administration Amendment (2004) Act*, except Sections 3 to 8, 12 and 17 to 22 thereof, come into force on and not before January 21, 2005;
- (b) Sections 12 and 17 to 22 of Chapter 24 of the Acts of 2004, the *Agriculture Administration Amendment (2004) Act*, come into force on and not before February 1, 2005;
- (c) Sections 3 to 8 of Chapter 24 of the Acts of 2004, the *Agriculture Administration Amendment (2004) Act*, come into force on and not before April 1, 2005;

NOW KNOW YE THAT WE, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of Nova Scotia, do by this Our Proclamation order and declare that:

- (a) Chapter 24 of the Acts of 2004, the *Agriculture Administration Amendment (2004) Act*, except Sections 3 to 8, 12 and 17 to 22 thereof, come into force on and not before January 21, 2005;
- (b) Sections 12 and 17 to 22 of Chapter 24 of the Acts of 2004, the *Agriculture Administration Amendment (2004) Act*, come into force on and not before February 1, 2005;
- (c) Sections 3 to 8 of Chapter 24 of the Acts of 2004, the *Agriculture Administration Amendment (2004) Act*, come into force on and not before April 1, 2005;
