1 These regulations may be cited as the *Vehicle Warning Lights Regulations*.

Definition

2 In these regulations,

- (a) "Act" means the *Motor Vehicle Act*;
- (b) "*Weights and Dimensions of Vehicles Regulations*" means the *Weights and Dimensions of Vehicles Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 137/2001, made under the Act.

Flashing or revolving yellow or amber light

- 3 (1) In accordance with subsection 179(6) of the Act, a flashing or revolving light that is displayed by any of vehicles permitted to do so by clause 179(5)(f), (g), (h), (i) or (j) of the Act must be designed to show only the colour yellow or amber in all directions.
- (2) The display of a flashing or revolving light that is designed to show only yellow or amber light in all directions is permitted on all of the following vehicles, in addition to the vehicles referred to in subsection (1):
- (a) a vehicle that is being operated under the terms of a special permit issued under the *Weights and Dimensions of Vehicles Regulations*;
 - (b) a vehicle that is acting as a pilot or an escort of a vehicle or combination of vehicles, if the escorted vehicle or combination of vehicles have been issued a special permit under the *Weights and Dimensions of Vehicles Regulations*;

- (c) any of the following vehicles, while it is being temporarily propelled or moved upon a highway:
 - (i) an implement of husbandry, including a farm tractor and a farm vehicle;
 - (ii) equipment or machinery used in road building or construction;
 - (d) a vehicle owned or engaged by the Province or a municipality while the vehicle is being operated in constructing, surveying or testing a highway;
 - (e) any vehicle while it is actually being operated to plough or remove snow;
 - (f) a public transit system service vehicle while it is being operated to provide service to a disabled bus;
 - (g) a vehicle that is owned or engaged by, or operated by an employee of, the Government of Canada, a federal crown corporation, the Province, a Nova Scotia crown corporation or a municipality while the vehicle is being operated to provide a public service that requires the operator to drive at a reduced speed or to make repeated stops along a highway;
 - (h) a vehicle while it is being operated in constructing, maintaining, surveying, testing or repairing a public utility.
- (3) Nothing in this Section precludes either of the following:
- (a) the flashing of a white or amber light to the front or the flashing of a red or amber light to the rear of a vehicle when the operator of the vehicle is signaling an intended change of direction in accordance with Section 119 of the Act;
 - (b) the simultaneous flashing of vehicular hazard warning signal lights to the front and rear of a vehicle, if the lights are installed in accordance with the *Motor Vehicle Safety Act* (Canada).

Red flashing or revolving light at front of ambulance

4 A display on an ambulance of a flashing or revolving red light that is visible from directly in front of the ambulance, as permitted by clauses 179(1)(a) and 179(5)(a) of the Act, is permitted only in the following circumstances:

- (a) the ambulance is being operated in response to a call about a person who needs emergency medical care;
- (b) the ambulance is parked at the scene of an accident or another emergency situation;
- (c) the ambulance is conveying a person who needs emergency medical care.

Flashing headlamps on police vehicle

5 The display of flashing headlamps is permitted on a police vehicle.

**Regulations Prescribing Insurance Review Board Guidelines
made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 159 of
Chapter 231 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,
the *Insurance Act***

Citation

1 These regulations may be cited as the *Insurance Review Board Guidelines Regulations*.

Definition

2 In these regulations,

- (a) “Act” means the *Insurance Act*;
- (b) “identified as a member of a rating bureau” means listed as a member of a rating bureau in a filing made by a rating bureau with the office of the Board under Section 152 of the Act;
- (c) “schedule” means a schedule of rates that may be filed by an insurer with the Board under Section 155B of the Act that decreases the rates that are being charged by the insurer before the date of the filing.

Notice to ineligible insurer

- 3 If a schedule is filed by an insurer that is identified as a member of a rating bureau, the Board must, no later than 5 days after the date the schedule is filed,
- (a) notify the insurer in writing that the insurer is identified as a member of a rating bureau and is not eligible to file a schedule under Section 155B of the Act; and
 - (b) return the schedule to the insurer.

Notice of intent to review

- 4 If a schedule is filed by an insurer who is not identified as a member of a rating bureau and the Board intends to review the schedule, the Board must, no later than 5 days after the date the schedule is filed, notify the insurer in writing that it intends to review the filing.

Deemed approval of schedule

- 5 If the Board fails to notify an insurer of its intent to review a schedule as required by Section 4, the schedule is deemed to have been approved by the Board and the Board has no further opportunity to review the filing.

Board review and notification

- 6 (1) If the Board notifies an insurer as required by Section 4 of its intent to review a schedule, the Board must, no later than 20 days after the date the schedule is filed,
- (a) review the schedule; and
 - (b) if the Board requires a change to or disapproves of the schedule, notify the insurer in writing of the required change or the disapproval and give reasonably adequate details about the Board’s reasons for the change or disapproval.
- (2) If the Board fails to notify an insurer as required by subsection (1) that it requires a change to or disapproves of a schedule, the schedule is deemed to have been approved by the Board and the Board has no further opportunity to review the filing.

Effective date of rate decreases

- 7 (1) Rate decreases in a schedule that is approved or deemed to be approved by the Board take effect on the later of
- (a) the date the schedule is filed; and
 - (b) subject to subsection (2), the rate decrease implementation date proposed by the insurer.
- (2) A rate decrease must take effect no later than 45 days after the date the schedule is filed.

**Regulations Respecting Electronic Information
made under Section 47 of Chapter 392 of
the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,
the *Registry Act***

Citation

1 These regulations may be cited as the *Electronic Information Regulations*.

Definitions

2 In these regulations,

- (a) “Act” means the *Registry Act*;
- (b) “authorized lawyer” means a qualified solicitor who is authorized to submit documents electronically using Property Online in accordance with the *Land Registration Administration Regulations*;
- (c) “authorized lender” means a chartered bank, trust company, credit union or Provincial government department that is authorized to submit documents electronically using Property Online in accordance with the *Land Registration Administration Regulations*;
- (d) “document” means a writing, a plan, a map or any information in a form that can be converted into a writing, a plan or a map by a machine or a device, and includes information

- (i) on microfilm,
 - (ii) in electronic, mechanical or magnetic storage, or
 - (iii) in electronic data signals;
- (e) “electronic document submission” means submission of a document using Property Online;
- (f) “Minister” means the Minister of Service Nova Scotia and Municipal Relations;
- (g) “qualified solicitor” means a member of the Nova Scotia Barristers’ Society entitled to practise law, but does not include a member who is subject to any limitation or restriction on practice imposed under the *Legal Profession Act* that precludes the member from certifying title to land;
- (h) “parcel” means any area of land that may be owned in fee simple absolute, and includes a unit as defined by the *Condominium Act*; and
- (i) “Property Online” means the Province’s online property information system that provides Internet browser-based query access to land-related information and electronic access for the submission of documents under the Act and the *Land Registration Act*.

Regulations override Act

- 3 In accordance with subsection 47(3) of the Act, if there is a conflict between these regulations and the Act, the requirements in the Act do not apply.

Non-electronic document submission requirements to facilitate copying

- 4 (1) A document that is submitted non-electronically for registration
- (i) must be typewritten in an ink that is not green or red and that remains visible when photocopied or scanned; and
 - (ii) must remain legible when photocopied or scanned.
- (2) A document attachment or plan that is submitted non-electronically for registration and that is larger than 11 in. by 17 in. must be submitted together with a duplicate original copy or a copy that has been certified to be a true copy of the original by a person authorized under the Act to sign a certificate of execution.

Electronic document submission

- 5 (1) To the extent permitted by Property Online, an authorized lawyer may submit electronically for registration any document, if it is a document that may be registered under the Act and registering the document is not prohibited under the *Land Registration Act*.
- (2) To the extent permitted by Property Online, an authorized lender may submit electronically for registration a release of mortgage with respect to a parcel that has not been registered under the *Land Registration Act*, and any document related to the release.
- (3) Electronic document submission is effected by submitting all of the following:
- (a) a completed cover page, as prescribed by the Minister;

- (b) a scanned copy of the duly executed affidavit of value, if required under the *Municipal Government Act*;
 - (c) a scanned copy of the duly executed original document in portable document format, no larger than 4 megabytes (MB).
- (4) Submitting a document electronically in accordance with these regulations has the same effect as submitting a document non-electronically in accordance with the Act.
- (5) A document submitted electronically for registration is deemed to be registered on the date and at the time when the document is reviewed and indexed by a registrar.
- (6) An authorized lawyer or authorized lender who submits a document electronically for registration is responsible for the creation, quality and completeness of the electronic image of the document.
- (7) An authorized lawyer or authorized lender who submits a document electronically for registration must retain an original or a true copy of the executed document and must make it available for review by the registrar upon request.

Consolidated and current indexes converted to electronic format

- 6 (1) A registrar may convert the consolidated and current indexes referred to in Section 11 of the Act to an electronic format.
- (2) If a registrar converts the indexes to an electronic format,
- (a) the registrar is no longer required to maintain the index books in the non-electronic format required under the Act;
 - (b) the registrar must maintain the indexes on an ongoing basis in electronic format; and
 - (c) the electronic indexes may consist of separate indexes for different categories of documents.
