Order in Council 2010-47 dated February 2, 2010 Amendment to regulations made by the Minister of Health and the Governor in Council pursuant to clause 13(1)(c) and subsection 17(2) of the *Health Services and Insurance Act* 

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Health dated December 22, 2009, and pursuant to Chapter 197 of the Revised Statues [Statutes] of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Health Services and Insurance Act* (the "Act"), is pleased, effective on and after February 2, 2010, to

- (a) pursuant to subsection 17(2) of the Act, amend the *Prosthetic Devices Tariffs Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 32/99, made by the Minister of Health and the Governor in Council by Order in Council 1999-146 dated April 7, 1999, in accordance with the increase to the amounts made by the Minister of Health pursuant to clause 13(1)(c) of the Act, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (b) approve the authorization by the Minister of Health of payments in respect of the tariff increases referred to in clause (a), in accordance with clause 13(1)(c) of the Act; and
- (c) pursuant to Section 8 of the Act, authorize the Minister of Health to enter into an agreement as set out in Schedule "B" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, or a form of agreement to like form and effect, with Banfield Ocular Prosthetic Services Limited respecting the provision of ocular prosthetic services. Reg. 4/2001, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2001-21 dated January 18, 2001, to make necessary minor corrections to the schedules under the *Wildlife Act*, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after February 2, 2010.

#### Order

I, Ross Landry, Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Nova Scotia, hereby order and direct pursuant to Section 8 of Chapter 450 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Summary Proceedings Act*, that the penalty to be entered on a summons in respect of an offence set out in amendments to the Schedules to the *Summary Offence Tickets Regulations*, N.S. **And whereas** the Nova Scotia Utility and Review ("Board") considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

**And whereas** the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended February 3, 2010, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline 55.5¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 56.0¢ per litre

**Now therefore** the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

Grade 1 55.5¢ per litre
Grade 2 58.5¢ per litre
Grade 3 61.5¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 56.0¢ per litre

And now therefore the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline: plus 0.5¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil: plus 0.7¢ per litre

And whereas a winter blending adjustment of plus 3.2¢ per litre is required for ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil;

**And now therefore** the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule "A" effective on and after 12:01 a.m., February 5, 2010.

Homes for Special Care Regulations

Order in Council 2010-62 dated February 9, 2010 Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 19 of the *Homes for Special Care Act* 

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Health dated January 5, 2010, and pursuant to Section 19 of Chapter 203 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Homes for Special Care Act*, is pleased to amend the *Homes for Special Care Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 127/77, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 77-1261 dated October 11, 1977, to prohibit facilities from requiring deposits, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after February 9, 2010.

#### Schedule "A"

Amendment to the *Homes for Special Care Regulations*made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 19 of Chapter 203
of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,
the *Homes for Special Care Act* 

- Subsection 28(2) of the *Homes for Special Care Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 127/77, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 77-1261 dated October 11, 1977, is amended by striking out "those residents who are being maintained solely by their own financial resources" and substituting "the residents".
- 2 The regulations are further amended by adding the following Sections immediately after Section 28B:
  - 28C The per diem rate charged for accommodation costs by a home for special care licensed by the Minister of Health may be charged at the beginning of each month for the following month, but a nursing home or home for the aged shall not require a resident of the home to pay in advance for any accommodation costs in addition to the per diem rate of the home.

- **28D** (1) An administrator of a home for special care licensed by the Minister of Health shall not require a resident of the home to pay in advance for services and shall not refuse to admit a person to the home because the person has not paid in advance for services.
  - (2) In subsection (1), "services" includes all of the following:
    - (a) hairdressing;
    - (b) barbering;
    - (c) dry-cleaning;
    - (d) telephone service in a resident's room;
    - (e) tax return preparation;
    - (f) transportation services;
    - (g) Internet or television services.
