Order dated November 22, 2011
Regulations made by the Provincial Traffic Authority for the Province of Nova Scotia pursuant to subsection 202(1) of the *Motor Vehicle Act*

In the Matter of subsection 202(1) of Chapter 293 of the Revised Statute[s] of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Motor Vehicle Act*

In the Matter of an Order respecting Winter Parking of Vehicles made by the Provincial Traffic Authority pursuant to subsection 202(1) of the *Motor Vehicle Act*

Order

I, Janice Harland, Provincial Traffic Authority, pursuant to subsection 202(1) of Chapter 293 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Motor Vehicle Act*, hereby make regulations respecting a probibition on parking vehicles in the forms set forth in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

This Order is effective December 15, 2011, to and including March 31, 2012.

Schedule "A"

Regulations respecting the Winter Parking Ban made by the Provincial Traffic Authority under subsection 202(1) of Chapter 293 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Motor Vehicle Act*

Citation

1 These regulations may be cited as the *Winter Parking Ban Regulations*.

Application

2 These regulations apply to any highway that is subject to the *Public Highways Act*.

Limitation on parking

- 3 Notwithstanding that certain traffic signs have been erected which may permit motor vehicles to park or stand upon sections of highway during the hours stated thereon, no owner, driver or person having control or custody of any vehicle shall park such vehicle upon any highway in Appendix A or any highway in the communities listed in Appendix A
 - (a) between the hours of one o'clock in the forenoon and six o'clock in the forenoon;

- in such a manner as to hinder, inconvenience or prevent the removal of snow or ice from such (b) highway unless it is attended by a person authorized and capable of operating it on a highway:
- from one hour after any snow storm has commenced to two hours after such snow storm has (c) stopped.

Determination of boundary

For the purposes of these regulations, the boundaries of a community shall be determined in accordance with Geographical Names Program established by the Government of Nova Scotia.

Exception

- Section 3 shall not apply to: 5
 - a motor vehicle that is (a)
 - (i) registered to a physician who is registered under the Medical Act.
 - (ii) parked reasonably near the physician's office or residence, and
 - (iii) immediately available to the physician for professional calls;
 - a motor vehicle parked by a physician who is registered under the *Medical Act* if (b)
 - the physician is engaged in his occupation, and (i)
 - the motor vehicle is parked in reasonable proximity to the location where the physician is engaged in his occupation;
 - (c) a motor vehicle registered to a police department, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police or the Canadian Armed Forces;
 - a commercial vehicle parked by a driver for the purpose of loading or unloading merchandise; (d)
 - a motor vehicle registered to a public utility as defined in the *Public Utilities Act* that is parked reasonably near the residence of its driver and immediately available for emergency calls.

Personal Services Contract Regulations

Order in Council 2011-403 dated November 24, 2011 Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 15 of the *Public Service Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Chair of Treasury Board and Minister of the Public Service Commission dated October 13, 2011, and pursuant to Section 15 of Chapter 376 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Public Service Act*, is pleased to amend the *Personal Services Contract Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 188/2005, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council [2005-443] dated September 30, 2005, to incorporate typographical corrections and name changes and add an additional Section,

in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after November 24, 2011.

Schedule "A"

Amendment to the *Personal Services Contract Regulations* made by the Governor in Council under Section 15 of Chapter 376 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Public Service Act*

- 1 The *Personal Services Contract Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 188/2005, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2005-443 dated September 30, 2005, are amended by striking out "Treasury and Policy Board" wherever it appears and substituting "Treasury Board".
- 2 Section 2 of the regulations is amended by adding the following clause immediately after clause (b):
 - (ba) "compensation framework" includes any policies, practices or plans that describe compensation, including descriptions of classifications, salary scales, pay for performance, bonuses, annual increments or cost of living adjustments;
- 3 The regulations are further amended by adding the following Section immediately after Section 7:

Compensation frameworks

- A compensation framework must comply with the directives and policies issued by the Treasury Board and must be filed with the Treasury Board Office annually and submitted to the Treasury Board for review and approval
 - (a) at least once every 5 years; and
 - (b) at any other time on the request of Treasury Board.
- 4 Schedule A to the regulations is amended by
 - (a) repealing clause 1(d) and substituting the following:
 - (d) to be bound by the principles and purposes of all of the following:
 - (i) Values, Ethics & Conduct: A Code for Nova Scotia's Public Servants, as prepared by the Public Service Commission;
 - (ii) the Government of Nova Scotia's Conflict of Interest Policy;
 - (iii) the Conflict of Interest Act.
 - (b) striking out "given" in clause 2(d) and substituting "granted";
 - (c) striking out "or extended by mutual agreement in writing" in Section 4;
 - (d) striking out "employee" immediately after "failure by the" in subsection 5(a) and substituting "Employee"; and
 - (e) striking out "unnecessary" in subsection 5(a).

Order

Whereas the purpose of the *Petroleum Products Pricing Regulations* is to ensure just and reasonable prices for specified petroleum products taking into consideration the objectives of preserving the availability of such products in rural areas, stabilizing prices of such products and minimizing the variances in prices of such products across the Province;

And whereas the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board ("Board") considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

And whereas the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended November 23, 2011, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline 69.8¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 83.1¢ per litre

Now therefore the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

Gasoline:

Grade 1 69.8¢ per litre
Grade 2 72.8¢ per litre
Grade 3 75.8¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 83.1¢ per litre

And now therefore the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline: minus 0.8¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil: plus 0.4¢ per litre

And whereas a winter blending adjustment of plus 2.1¢ per litre is required for ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil;

And now therefore the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule "A" effective on and after 12:01 a.m., November 25, 2011.

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of the Public Service Commission dated November 7, 2011, and pursuant to Section 45 of Chapter 70 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia 1989, the *Civil Service Act*, is pleased to approve of amendments made by the Public Service Commission to the *General Civil Service Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 311/2009, made by the Public Service Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2009-453 dated October 27, 2009, to grant additional vacation to new appointees into excluded positions in the Nova Scotia civil service if specified criteria are met, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after January 1, 2012.

Reg. 311/2009, made by the Public Service Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2009-453 dated October 27, 2009, in the manner set out in the attached.

This amendment is effective on and after the date of its approval by the Governor in Council.

Amendment to the *General Civil Service Regulations*made by the Public Service Commission under Section 45 of Chapter 70
of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Civil Service Act*

- The *General Civil Service Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 311/2009, made by the Public Service Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2009-453 dated October 27, 2009, are amended by striking out "Vacation" in the heading immediately before subsection 72(1) and substituting "Annual vacation".
- 2 Subsection 72(1) of the regulations is amended by adding "(2A), (2B)," immediately before "(3)".
- 3 Section 72 of the regulations is further amended by adding the following subsections immediately after subsection (2):

- (2A) An employee is entitled to receive vacation leave with pay at the rate of 1 2/3 days for each month of service during their first 180 months of service if all of the following apply:
 - (a) the employee is appointed on or after January 1, 2012;
 - (b) the employee has at least 5 and up to 15 years of full-time service accumulated through non-civil-service employment before their appointment;
 - (c) the employee was entitled to at least 20 days of annual vacation leave with pay with their place of employment immediately before their appointment;
 - (d) the employment referred to in clause (c) ended within the 180 days immediately before the employee's appointment date.
- (2B) An employee is entitled to receive vacation leave with pay at the rate of 2 1/12 days for each month of service during their first 288 months of service if all of the following apply:
 - (a) the employee is appointed on or after January 1, 2012;
 - (b) the employee has more than 15 years of full-time service accumulated through non-civil-service employment before their appointment;
 - (c) the employee was entitled to at least 25 days of annual vacation leave with pay with their place of employment immediately before their appointment;
 - (d) the employment referred to in clause (c) ended within the 180 days immediately before the employee's appointment date.
- (2C) Before granting an employee vacation leave under subsection (2A) or (2B), the employer must obtain proof of the employee's annual vacation entitlement in their previous place of employment.
- Subsection 72(4) of the regulations is amended by striking out "subsection (3) must not be increased until their vacation leave entitlement under subsection (3)" and substituting "subsection (2A), (2B) or (3) must not be increased until their vacation leave entitlement under that subsection".

Subsection 3(2) of the *Off-highway Vehicles Fees Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 103/2004, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2004-138 dated March 30, 2004, is repealed and the following subsection substituted:

(2) The fees as set out in the following table are prescribed as payable to the Snowmobilers Association of Nova Scotia by operators of snow vehicles for the use of designated trail permits under the *Off-highway Vehicles Designated Trails and Trail Permit Regulations*:

Whereas the purpose of the *Petroleum Products Pricing Regulations* is to ensure just and reasonable prices for specified petroleum products taking into consideration the objectives of preserving the availability of such products in rural areas, stabilizing prices of such products and minimizing the variances in prices of such products across the Province;

And whereas the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board ("Board") considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

And whereas the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended November 30, 2011, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline 70.2¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 81.8¢ per litre

Now therefore the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

Gasoline:

Grade 1 70.2ϕ per litre Grade 2 73.2ϕ per litre Grade 3 76.2ϕ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 81.8ϕ per litre

And now therefore the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline: minus 1.2¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil: minus 0.5¢ per litre

And whereas a winter blending adjustment of plus 2.6¢ per litre is required for ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil;

And now therefore the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule "A" effective on and after 12:01 a.m., December 2, 2011.

The *Milk Pricing Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 84/2008, made by the Dairy Farmers of Nova Scotia on September 21, 2007, and approved by the Natural Products Marketing Council on February 12, 2008, are amended by repealing subsection 3(1) and substituting the following subsection:

3 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), the prices payable by processors in Nova Scotia for milk components are as set out in the following table, and are payable on a free on board (FOB) plant basis:
