The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Fisheries and Aquaculture dated December 23, 2014, and pursuant to subsections 53(2) and 113(1) of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act*, is pleased to amend the *Fishing Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 29/88, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 88-131 dated February 9, 1988, to allow for residents and non-residents to sport fish in Provincial waters on the February statutory holiday and on the Saturday or Sunday immediately preceding the February statutory holiday without having to purchase or possess a general fishing ~~license~~ [licence], and to make certain housekeeping changes, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A”, attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after January 29, 2015.

**Sport fishing weekends**

**6A** Despite Sections 4 and 6, but still subject to the licensing provisions for Atlantic salmon, a person is not required to purchase or possess a Resident General Fishing Licence or a Non-Resident General Fishing Licence to fish in Provincial waters on any of the following days:

- (a) the third Monday in February;
- (b) the Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding the holiday listed in clause (a);
- (c) the first consecutive Saturday and Sunday of June.

1 These regulations may be cited as the *Health Authorities Act General Regulations*.

**Definitions**

2 (1) In these regulations,

“Act” means the *Health Authorities Act*, Chapter 32 of the Acts of 2014.

(2) In the Act,

“eligible to represent a bargaining unit”, with respect to a union that represents registered nurses or licensed practical nurses within the meaning of clause 89(1)(d) of the Act, means, in addition to meeting the criteria set out in that clause, that the union represents a majority of the total number of unionized registered nurses and unionized licensed practical nurses employed in the provincial health authority and the IWK Health Centre, combined, estimated as of November 25, 2014, and without consideration as to whether the union represents a majority of the total number of unionized registered nurses and unionized licensed practical nurses employed in the provincial health authority alone or the IWK Health Centre alone as of that date.

**Whereas** the purpose of the *Petroleum Products Pricing Regulations* is to ensure just and reasonable prices for specified petroleum products taking into consideration the objectives of preserving the availability of such products in rural areas, stabilizing prices of such products and minimizing the variances in prices of such products across the Province;

**And whereas** the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (“Board”) considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

**And whereas** the Board revised the retail margin and transportation allowance effective January 6, 2012, in its decision, 2011 NSUARB 181, issued on November 23, 2011;

**And whereas** the Board revised the wholesale margin effective January 4, 2013, in its decision, 2012 NSUARB 213, issued on December 12, 2012;

**And whereas** the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended January 28, 2015, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline	44.5¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil	53.7¢ per litre

**Now therefore** the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

Gasoline:	
Grade 1	44.5¢ per litre
Grade 2	47.5¢ per litre
Grade 3	50.5¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil	53.7¢ per litre

**And now therefore** the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline:	minus 0.8¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil:	minus 1.2¢ per litre

**And whereas** a winter blending adjustment of plus 7.7¢ per litre is required for ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil;

**And now therefore** the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule “A” effective on and after 12:01 a.m., January 30, 2015.
