3. The maps of the 9 polling districts are set out in Schedule "A", attached to and forming part of this order;

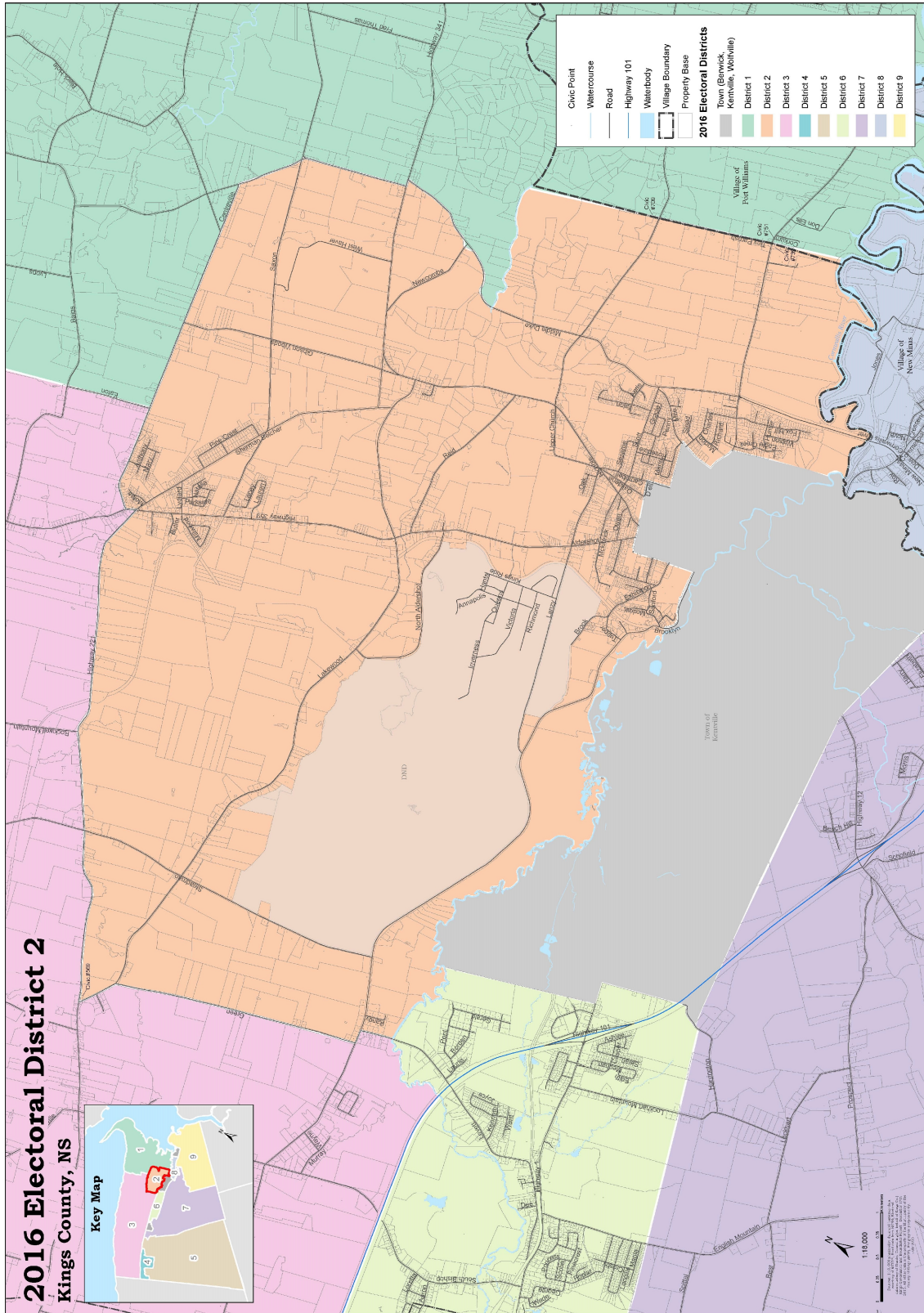
