Nova Scotia Child Benefit Regulations-amendment

Order in Council 2020-180 dated June 25, 2020 Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 80 of the *Income Tax Act* 

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Finance and Treasury Board and the Minister of Community Services dated May 25, 2020, and pursuant to Section 80 of Chapter 217 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia,1989, the *Income Tax Act*, is pleased to amend the *Nova Scotia Child Benefit Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 62/1998, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 1998-430 dated August 28, 1998, to increase the Nova Scotia Child Benefit rates, and to increase the partial and upper income thresholds for the Nova Scotia Child Benefit, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after July 1, 2020.

### Schedule "A"

Amendment to the *Nova Scotia Child Benefit Regulations* made by the Governor in Council under Section 80 of Chapter 217 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Income Tax Act* 

- Section 3 of the *Nova Scotia Child Benefit Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 62/1998, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 1998-430 dated August 28, 1998, is repealed and the following Section substituted:
  - Where a person and, where the Minister so demands, the person's cohabiting spouse or common-law partner at the end of the taxation year, have filed a return of income for the year, an overpayment on account of the person's liability under Part II of the Act for the year shall be deemed to have arisen during a month in relation to which the year is the base taxation year, equal to the amount determined by the following formula:

$$NSCB = [1/12 (A + B + C)] - D$$

where

A is \$925 for the first qualified dependant in respect of whom the person was an eligible individual at the beginning of the month,

B is \$825 for the second qualified dependant, if any, in respect of whom the person was an eligible individual at the beginning of the month,

C is the amount calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$C = \$900 \times E$$

where E is the number of qualified dependants in excess of two in respect of whom the person was an eligible individual at the beginning of the month, and

D is the benefit reduction applicable to the eligible individual which is calculated in accordance with Section 4.

- 2 Section 4 of the regulations is repealed and the following Section substituted:
  - 4 (1) Where the adjusted income of the eligible individual for the base taxation year in relation to the month is less than \$26,000, D equals zero.
    - (2) Where the adjusted income of the eligible individual for the base taxation year in relation to the month is equal to or greater than \$26 000 and less than \$34 000,
      - (a) if there is only 1 qualified dependant in respect of whom the person was an eligible individual at the beginning of the month,

D = 0.

(b) if there are only 2 qualified dependants in respect of whom the person was an eligible individual at the beginning of the month,

 $D = 1/12 \times 50\% \times B$ , where B is as defined in Section 3.

(c) if there are more than 2 qualified dependants in respect of whom the person was an eligible individual at the beginning of the month,

 $D = 1/12 \times 50\% \times (B + C)$ , where B and C are as defined in Section 3.

Whereas the purpose of the *Petroleum Products Pricing Regulations* is to ensure just and reasonable prices for specified petroleum products taking into consideration the objectives of preserving the availability of such products in rural areas, stabilizing prices of such products and minimizing the variances in prices of such products across the Province;

And whereas the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board ("Board") considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum product prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

**And whereas** the Board revised the wholesale margin effective January 4, 2013, in its decision, 2012 NSUARB 213, issued on December 12, 2012;

And whereas the Board revised the retail margin and the transportation allowance effective October 28, 2016, in its decision, 2016 NSUARB 168, issued on September 26, 2016;

**And whereas** the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the period ended June 24, 2020, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline 43.19¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 42.98¢ per litre

Now therefore the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

#### Gasoline:

Grade 1	43.19¢ per litre
Grade 2	46.19¢ per litre
Grade 3	49.19¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil	42.98¢ per litre

**And now therefore** the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline: plus  $0.8\phi$  per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil: plus  $0.5\phi$  per litre

**And now therefore** the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule "A" effective on and after 12:01 a.m., June 26, 2020.
