(b) the person does not have, and has never had, any interest in chicken quota as set out in Section
[subsection] 9(1) or in any type of quota under the Act, the *Dairy Industry Act*, or similar legislation in other provinces of Canada;


The Municipality of the District of Lunenburg filed an application under s. 369 of the *Municipal Government Act* and the Board issued its Decision on September 26, 2023;


The Board approves the application and orders that:


- 1. The number of polling districts for the Municipality is set at ten (10);

The Municipality of the County of Annapolis filed an application under s. 369 of the *Municipal Government Act* and the Board issued its Decision on October 19, 2023;

The Board approves the application and orders that:

- 1. The number of polling districts for the Municipality is set at eleven (11);
- 2. The number of councillors is set at eleven (11);

- 3. The boundaries of the polling districts are approved as outlined in the application and as shown on the digital maps attached to this Order; [and]
- 4. All provisions of the *Municipal Government Act* and the *Municipal Elections Act* and any other Acts of the Province of Nova Scotia applying to the preparation for and holding of the regular election of councillors of the Municipality in the year 2024 will be complied with as if the above-noted changes had been made on the first day of March, 2024, but for all other purposes, such changes shall take effect on the first day of the first meeting of the Council after the election of councillors for the year 2024.

The Board further orders and directs the Municipality to conduct a new study into its polling districts and boundaries. The Municipality is to apply to the Board before **December 31, 2025**, outlining the results of the public consultation and whether the Municipality proposes to alter or confirm the number and boundaries of the polling districts.
