The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Natural Resources dated April 5, 2000, pursuant to subsection 113(1) of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act*, is pleased to amend the General Wildlife Regulations made by Order in Council 87-1181 dated September 29, 1987, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation.

**Amendments to the *General Wildlife Regulations* made by the Governor  
in Council pursuant to subsection 113(1) of Chapter 504 of  
the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act***

- 1 Section 3A of the *General Wildlife Regulations* made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 87-1181 dated September 29, 1987, is amended by repealing subsection (2) and substituting the following subsection:
  - (2) The fee for a wildlife habitat stamp is \$2.00.
- 2 Subsection 6(7) of the regulations is amended by:
  - (a) adding "within 48 hours of the escape" immediately following "to a conservation officer" in clause (b); and
  - (b) adding the following clause immediately following clause (b):
    - (c) Any wildlife not recovered within 15 days after its escape shall become the property of Her Majesty the Queen in Right of the Province.

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Natural Resources dated April 5, 2000, pursuant to subsection 113(1) of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act*, is pleased to amend the Small Game Hunting Regulations made by Order in Council 87-957 dated August 18, 1987, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation.

**Amendments to the *Small Game Hunting Regulations* made by the Governor in Council pursuant to subsection 113(1) of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act***

- 1 Subsections 4(4), (5) and (6) of the *Small Game Hunting Regulations* made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 87-957 dated August 18, 1987, are repealed and the following subsection substituted:
  - (4) No person who is over 12 and under 18 years of age shall hunt small game with a firearm or bow unless
    - (a) the person possesses
      - (i) a valid Firearm Hunting Certificate, if hunting with a firearm, or
      - (ii) a valid Bowhunter Hunting Certificate, if hunting with a bow,issued to the person;
    - (b) the appropriate licence is acquired by the parent or guardian and the applicant and the parent or guardian both sign the licence; and
    - (c) the person is under the immediate supervision of the parent or guardian or any other responsible person 18 years of age or over who possesses a valid Firearm Hunting Certificate, if the hunting is done with a firearm, or a valid Bowhunter Hunting Certificate, if the hunting is done with a bow.
  - (5) A person of any age may snare snowshoe hare.

- 2 (1) Subsection 5(1) of the regulations is amended by adding “or a valid base licence in circumstances permitted by these regulations,” immediately following “Licence”.
- (2) Clause 5(2)(a) of the regulations is amended by striking out “Nov. 15th” and substituting “Nov. 1st”.
- 3 Subsection 12(1) of the regulations is amended by adding “or base licence issued pursuant to regulations made under the Act” immediately following “these regulations”.

Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council  
pursuant to Section 18  
of the *Family Benefits Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Community Services dated April 18, 2000, pursuant to Section 18 of Chapter 158 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Family Benefits Act*, is pleased to amend the Family Benefits Schedule "B" Regulations in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective May 1, 2000.

### Schedule "A"

**Amendments to the *Family Benefits Schedule "B" Regulations*  
made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 18 of Chapter 158  
of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Family Benefits Act***

- 1 The *Family Benefits Schedule "B" Regulations* made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 87-430 dated April 7, 1987, are amended by adding the following Section immediately after Section 2:
  - 2A The eligibility of any person who signs an application for family benefits or reapplies for family benefits on or after May 1, 2000 or whose initial eligibility is being assessed on or after April 11, 2000, shall be determined on the basis of these regulations, except that
    - (a) any reference in the regulations to Appendix "A" shall be read as a reference to Appendix "B";
    - (b) in an instance where the person or the person's spouse is under the age of 19 years, the amounts prescribed in Appendix "B" for food, clothing and miscellaneous essentials allowances for persons 18 years of age shall apply;
    - (c) in the calculation of the person's budget deficit, Sections 35, 40 and 42 shall not apply;
    - (d) the minimum monthly charge to be included as income from a boarder shall be \$40.00 per month instead of the \$78.50 as prescribed in subclause 44(2)(b)(ii);
    - (e) in the calculation of the person's income pursuant to Section 44, clause 44(2)(a) and subsections 44(3), 44(10) and 44(11) shall not apply;

- (f) income from wages shall be computed at 100% of net wages earned, and the Director shall deduct \$100.00 from the net wages where the person has dependents or \$50.00 where the person is single;
  - (g) Sections 45 and 46, respecting cash or liquid assets that a person may retain before they are considered ineligible for benefits, shall not apply.
- 2 Subsection 23(2) of the regulations is repealed.
  - 3 Subsection 51(1) of the regulations is amended by adding “, except that the Director may prescribe a payment of a co-pay fee that may be different than the amount prescribed in the Prescription Drug Plan Regulations and the Prescription Drug Plan Program” immediately after the second occurrence of “Prescription Drug Plan Program”, at the end of the subsection.
  - 4 The regulations are further amended by adding the attached Appendix “B” to Schedule “B”.

### **Appendix "B" to Schedule "B"**

#### **Prescribed Allowances and Expenses**

- 1 For the purposes of subsection 28(2),
  - (a) the amount of \$98.00 per month is prescribed as a health services allowance;
  - (b) the amount of \$118.00 per month is prescribed as a special diabetic food allowance.
- 2 For the purposes of clause 32(1)(a),
  - (a) the amount of \$197.00 per month is prescribed where there is 1 person in the budget;
  - (b) the amount of \$229.00 per month is prescribed where there are 2 persons in the budget;
  - (c) the amount of \$270.00 per month is prescribed where there are 3 or more persons in the budget.
- 3 For the purposes of clause 32(1)(b) and subsection 32(2), the allowances for food, clothing and miscellaneous essentials are prescribed in the following amounts and in the following manner:

- 4 For the purposes of subsection 32(4), the amount of \$29.00 per month is prescribed as a maternal nutritional allowance.
- 5 For the purposes of Section 41,
- the amount of \$487.00 per month is prescribed where there is 1 person in the budget;
  - the amount of \$524.00 per month is prescribed where there are 2 persons in the budget;
  - the amount of \$569.00 per month is prescribed where there are 3 or more persons in the budget.
- 6 For the purposes of subsection 44(4) the following amounts are prescribed:
- \$314.00 per month where there is 1 adult boarder;
  - \$453.00 per month where the boarders are 1 adult and 1 child;
  - \$566.00 per month where the boarders are 1 adult and 2 children;
  - where the boarders are 1 adult and 3 or more children, the amount of \$566.00 shall be increased by \$54.00 per month for the third and subsequent children;
  - \$536.00 per month where the boarders are 2 adults;
  - \$597.00 per month where the boarders are 2 adults and 1 child;
  - \$654.00 per month where the boarders are 2 adults and 2 children;
  - where the boarders are 2 adults and 3 or more children, the amount of \$654.00 shall be increased by \$54.00 per month for the third and subsequent children.

### **Schedule A**

#### **DISTRICT 1**

The legal description of District 1 is as follows:

“Situate on the north side of the Annapolis River and beginning at the Annapolis River where the same crosses the west boundary of the County of Kings; thence northwardly following the west boundary of the County of Kings to the top of North Mountain; thence turning and running westwardly along the top of the North Mountain to the intersection of the Vault Road (408) and the Dodge Road (412); thence turning and running southerly on a straight line course to the intersection of the Spa Springs Road (407) and the Watton Brook; thence continuing southerly following the Watton Brook to the McColough Road (414); thence continuing southerly following Watton Brook to Highway #101; thence turning and running easterly following the centreline of Highway #101 (approximately 870 metres), to a point in line with the property boundary between lands currently owned by the Nova Scotia Department of Transportation & Public Works (PID:05033923) and 2208731 Nova Scotia Limited (PID:05028782); thence turning and running southerly following the said property boundary on a straight line course, also following the property boundary between 2208731 Nova Scotia Limited (PID:05028782) and Scott Earl Veinot (PID:050528899) continuing on to Highway #1 at Wilmot; thence turning westerly and following the centre line of Highway #1 for [approximately 55 m (180 ft.)], that being a point in line with the property boundary between lands currently owned by Peter L. Nejrup (PID:05028840) and George R. Noble (PID:05028881); thence turning and running southerly following said property boundary and continuing on a straight line course to the Annapolis River, [this boundary line being a setback from the centreline of the Old Mill Road (744) on the west side, of approximately 152 m. (500 ft.)]; thence turning and running easterly following the Annapolis River to the place of beginning.”

**DISTRICT 2**

The legal description of District 2 is as follows:

“Situate on the north side of the Annapolis River and beginning at the Annapolis River at the southwest corner of Polling District Number One, that being a point on the Annapolis River which is approximately 152 m (500 ft.) west from the centreline of the Old Mill Road (744); thence northwardly on a straight line course (approximately 152 m. (500 ft.) from the centreline of the Old Mill Road (744)) to the southwest corner of lands currently owned by Peter J. Nejrup (PID:05028840); thence following the property boundary between Nejrup (PID:05028840) and lands currently owned by George R. Noble (PID:05028881) to Highway #1; thence turning and running easterly along the centreline of Highway #1, approximately 55 m. 67(2) No person shall release or permit the release into the  
environment of a substance in an amount, concentration or level  
or at a rate of release that causes or may cause a significant  
adverse effect, unless authorized by an approval or the  
regulations.

- 71 Any person responsible for the release of a substance under this Part shall, at that person's own cost, and as soon as that person knows or ought to have known of the release of a substance into the environment that has caused, is causing or may cause an adverse effect,
- (a) take all reasonable measures to
    - (i) prevent, reduce and remedy the adverse effects of the substance, and
    - (ii) remove or otherwise dispose of the substance in such a manner as to minimize adverse effects;
  - (b) take any other measures required by an inspector or an administrator; and
  - (c) rehabilitate the environment to a standard prescribed or adopted by the Department.

III. **AND WHEREAS** the Minister of the Environment is of the opinion that it is in the public interest to do all things and take all steps necessary to comply with the *Environment Act* or to repair any injury or damage, or to control, eliminate or manage an adverse effect;

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:**

That pursuant to subsection 125(1) of the *Environment Act*, the person named in this Ministerial Order shall, at their own cost, comply with the terms and conditions, including compliance times, set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of this Ministerial Order.

**AND TAKE NOTICE** if the person to whom this Ministerial Order is directed fails to comply with the Ministerial Order, or any part thereof, the Minister, pursuant to Section 132 of the *Environment Act*, may take whatever action the Minister considers necessary to carry out the terms and conditions of the Ministerial Order and may recover any reasonable costs, expenses and charges incurred by the Minister.

**AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE** that the appeal provisions respecting the issuance of a Ministerial Order are more fully outlined in Section 138 of the *Environment Act*, including a 30 day time period from the date of the issuance of the Ministerial Order to file an appeal.

**1. Site Assessment**

On or before May 13, 2000, the persons named in this Ministerial Order shall conduct a further site assessment, as described by Donald A. Carey of Jacques Whitford Environment Limited in his April 11, 2000 letter to Robert Grant, in accordance with current guidelines for the management of contaminated sites in Nova Scotia, using existing data and additional information as required to define the extent of contaminant impacts, both on and off the Site;

**2. Remedial Action Plan**

On or before June 17, 2000, the person(s) named in this Ministerial Order shall submit to the contact person for the Nova Scotia Department of the Environment a **remedial action plan** prepared by an environmental site professional which will include and address the following:

- (a) the on-Site and off-Site contamination identified by Jacques Whitford Environment Limited as a result of its Site assessments and investigations;
- (b) the hydrocarbon contamination on the Site identified in a January 10, 2000 letter from G.A. McBeath of EARTHTECH Engineering Limited to Sobeyes;
- (c) a description of the methodologies, remedial techniques and corrective action strategies to be used for implementation of the remedial action plan;
- (d) a description of the monitoring program to be used for the duration of the remedial work;
- (e) a time schedule to implement the remedial action plan.

**3. Implementation**

Within 5 days of receipt of approval of the remedial action plan by the Nova Scotia Department of the Environment, the person(s) named in this Ministerial Order shall commence work under the remedial action plan and complete the work within the approved time periods.

**4. Progress Reports**

Once remediation has commenced under Section 3, the person(s) named in this Ministerial Order shall submit a written progress report to the Nova Scotia Department of the Environment on a bi-weekly basis or at more frequent intervals if required by the Department.

**5. Time Extension Request**

The Minister may consider a time extension only if the person(s) named in the Ministerial Order submit a written request to the departmental contact person named below. This written submission will provide the reasons and a detailed justification for the time extension request.
