The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Agriculture dated October 8, 2025, and pursuant to Section 4 of Chapter 15 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Animal Health and Protection Act*, is pleased to amend the *Animal Health and Protection Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 67/2021, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2021-107 dated April 27, 2021, to replace the definition of “disease” and to change the eligibility for appointment as an inspector under the Act and regulations, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after January 21, 2025.

 - (a) striking out “to test for any disease” and substituting “to collect samples for the purpose of testing for or diagnosing any disease” in subclause (ii); and
 - (b) striking out “diagnosis,” in subclause (iii).
