Disposition Order

Whereas on 4 April, 2013, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of a mental disorder on charges of failing to comply (three counts), contrary to section 245(3) of the Criminal Code; assaulting a peace officer, contrary to section 270(1)(a) of the Criminal Code; breach of probation (two counts), contrary to section 733.1(1)(a) of the Criminal Code; and mischief (two counts), contrary to section 430(4) of the Criminal Code of Canada;

And whereas the accused is presently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital;

And whereas a Zoom hearing was held on the 10th day of November, 2020, to make a disposition order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code of Canada;

And whereas the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made.

The Board finds that the Restriction of Liberties was justified.

This is therefore to command you, the administrator of the East Coast Forensic Hospital, in her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this order.
