DISPOSITION ORDER

WHEREAS on the 27th day of January 2016, the accused was found Not Criminally Responsible on account of a mental disorder on charges of assault with a weapon, contrary to Section 267(a) and breach of probation, contrary to Section 733.1(1)(a) of the Criminal Code of Canada;

AND WHEREAS the accused is presently detained at the Central Nova Scotia Correctional Facility.

AND WHEREAS a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Psychiatric Hospital on the 14th day of April 2025 to make a Disposition Order pursuant to s.672.54 of the *Criminal Code of Canada*.

AND WHEREAS the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment, or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

IT IS ORDERED that the accused, when not incarcerated, be detained at the East Coast Forensic Psychiatric Hospital with a board community access ceiling level of L2.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if the accused is arrested pursuant to section

672.91 of the Criminal Code for a breach or anticipated breach of the terms of this disposition, they may, under section 672.92(1)(b) of the Criminal Code, be delivered to the East Coast Forensic Hospital, 88 Gloria McCluskey Avenue, Dartmouth, Nova Scotia.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Director, Mental Health Program, Nova Scotia Health Authority, in His Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order. The Board delegates to them the authority to increase or decrease the liberties of the accused pursuant to section 672.56(1).
