Disposition Order

Whereas on the 27th day of January, 2016, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of a mental disorder on charges of assault with a weapon, contrary to s. 267(a) of the Criminal Code; and breach of probation, contrary to s. 733.1(1)(a) of the Criminal Code;

And Whereas the accused is presently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital;

And Whereas a hearing was held by Zoom conference on the 19th day of October, 2020, to make a disposition order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code;


And whereas the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made

It is ordered that there be no change to Mr. Issak's current disposition.

The Board finds that the restriction of liberties was justified

This is therefore to command you, the Director, Mental Health and Addictions Program, Nova Scotia Health Authority, in her Majesty's name to execute the terms of this order. The Board delegates to the Director, pursuant to section 672.56 (1), the authority to direct that the restrictions on the liberties of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits set out in this disposition.
