## **Disposition Order**

Whereas on the seventh day of January, 2019, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of a mental disorder on charges of robbery, contrary to section 344 of the Criminal Code; assault with a weapon, contrary to section 267(a) of the Criminal Code; carries or possesses a weapon, contrary to section 88(2) of the Criminal Code; failure to comply with undertaking, contrary to section 145(5.1) of the Criminal Code; breach of probation, four counts, contrary to section 733.1(1) of the Criminal Code; and theft, contrary to section 334(b) of the Criminal Code of Canada;

And whereas the accused is presently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital;

And whereas a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Hospital by Zoom conference on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2020, to make a disposition order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code of Canada;

And whereas the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made.

It is ordered that there be no change to the current disposition of the accused.

The Board finds that the restriction of liberties was justified

This is therefore to command you, the administrator the East Coast Forensic Hospital, in her Majesty's name to execute the terms of this order. The Board delegates to the administrator, pursuant to section 672.56(1), the authority to direct that the restrictions on the liberties of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits set out in this disposition.
