

IN THE MATTER OF the NOVA SCOTIA REVIEW BOARD
AND IN THE MATTER OF the accused, BRADLEY MacINTYRE
AND IN THE MATTER OF a hearing held pursuant to section 672.47 of the Criminal Code

DISPOSITION ORDER

WHEREAS on the 31st day of July, 2017, the accused was found not criminally responsible on charges of injuring an animal, contrary to section 445(a) of the Criminal Code; assault, contrary to section 266(a) of the Criminal Code; assault with a weapon, contrary to section 267(a) of the Criminal Code; unlawful confinement, contrary to section 279(2) of the Criminal Code; uttering threats, contrary to section 264.1 of the Criminal Code; assaulting a peace officer with a weapon, contrary to section 270.01 of the Criminal Code (2 counts) and possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose, contrary to section 88(1) of the Criminal Code;

AND WHEREAS the accused is presently detained in hospital;

AND WHEREAS a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Hospital on the 26th of September, 2017, to make an order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code;

AND WHEREAS the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made.

IT IS ORDERED that the accused continue to be detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital with a ceiling of privileges of L6.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Director, Mental Health Program, Nova Scotia Health Authority, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order. The Board delegates to him pursuant to section 672.56(1) the authority to direct that the restrictions on the liberties of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits set out in this disposition.
