## **DISPOSITION ORDER**

WHEREAS on the 2nd day of November 2023, the accused was found *Unfit to Stand Trail* on charges of: **Assault with a Weapon** contrary to s.267(a) and on a charge of **Aggravated Assault** contrary to s.268(1) of the *Criminal Code of Canada*.

AND WHEREAS the accused presently resides at Quest Society, in the community.

**AND WHEREAS** a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Psychiatric Hospital on the 18th day of June 2024 to make a Disposition Order pursuant to s.672.54 of the *Criminal Code of Canada*.

**AND WHEREAS** the East Coast Forensic Psychiatric Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment, or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made.

IT IS ORDERED THAT there be no change in the current disposition.

**AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that if the accused is arrested pursuant to section 672.91 of the Criminal Code for a breach or anticipated breach of the terms of this disposition, they may, under section 672.92(1)(b) of the Criminal Code, be delivered to the East Coast Forensic Hospital, 88 Gloria McCluskey Avenue, Dartmouth, Nova

Scotia.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Director, Mental Health Program, Nova Scotia Health Authority, in His Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order. The Board delegates to them the authority to increase or decrease the liberties of the accused pursuant to section 672.56(1).

The Board also finds that the accused is permanently unfit to stand trial.

For clarity, this hearing is also considered to be an annual hearing.
