## **DISPOSITION ORDER**

**WHEREAS** on the 9<sup>th</sup> of March, 2021, the accused was found Not Criminally Responsible on account of a mental disorder on charges of: attempt to commit murder, contrary to s.239(1)(a) of the Criminal Code; causes bodily harm to Peace Officer, contrary to  $s.270.01(1)(B) \times 2$  of the Criminal Code; breach of probation, contrary to s.733.1(1) of the Criminal Code; possession of a weapon for dangerous purpose, contrary to s.88 of the Criminal Code; and uttering threats to cause death or bodily harm, contrary to  $s.264.1(1)(A) \times 3$  of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the accused is currently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital with a ceiling level of privileges of L4;

**AND WHEREAS** a hearing was held on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 2023 to make a Disposition Order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment, or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

**IT IS ORDERED THAT** the accused continue to be detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital with a ceiling level of privileges of L4;

**THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU**, the Director, Mental Health Program, Nova Scotia Health Authority, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order. The Board delegates to them the authority to increase or decrease the liberties of the accused pursuant to section 672.56(1). **DATED** at Halifax, this 19<sup>th</sup> day of August 2023.
