## **DISPOSITION ORDER**

**WHEREAS** on the 30th of May 2022, the accused was found unfit to stand trial on charges of break and enter contrary to s.348(1)(b) x3, mischief contrary to s.430(4) and possession of break-in instruments contrary to s.351(1) x3, of the Criminal Code of Canada;

**AND WHEREAS** the accused is currently residing at the East Coast Forensic Hospital with an interim level of privileges of L2 (medical);

**AND WHEREAS** a hearing was held on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October 2022 and the 7<sup>th</sup> day of November 2022 to make a Disposition Order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code:

**AND WHEREAS** the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment, or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

IT IS ORDERED THAT the accused be conditionally discharged, on the following terms:

- 1. Keep the peace and be of good behaviour;
- 2. Maintain good mental health;
- 3. Adhere to the recommendations of the Community Mental Health Team;
- 4. Comply with follow-up by the Forensic Community Program;
- 5. Comply with conditions recommended by the Forensic Community Program;

6. Abstain from alcohol, and/or illicit drugs and comply with random urine drug screening;

7. Reside in the premises approved by the East Coast Forensic Hospital and

abide by the rules and regulations of the residence;

8. Notify the Review Board and the East Coast Forensic Hospital of any change

of address;

9. Appear before the Board when requested; and

10. Remain within the Province of Nova Scotia unless authorization in writing has

been received from the Board.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Director, Mental Health Program,

Nova Scotia Health Authority, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this

Order. The Board delegates to them the authority to increase or decrease the

liberties of the accused pursuant to section 672.56(1).

The Board also finds that the accused is unfit to stand trial.
