## Message from the Minister of Justice

I am pleased to provide the third annual Department of Justice report on activity under the Nova Scotia *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. It reflects the government's accountability under this legislation, and continues to fulfill the commitment to annually report on the statistics regarding applications under the *FOIPOP Act*. It also marks the second year that we have provided data on all public bodies and municipalities who are subject to the legislation, and who have been known in the past to receive some FOIPOP applications.

Our staff have diligently attempted to capture the total activity in both areas by gathering the data that is summarized in the following pages. Because we rely on other organizations to provide statistics, we caution that we cannot guarantee 100 percent accuracy. However, it is our view that the information contained in this report is a accurate representation of activity under the legislation. I also note that the data does not, with the exception of information about fees collected, reflect the statistics of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Review Office.

This report also marks the first year that we are reporting on total activity under the Government's and individual department's routine access policies that were instituted in the fall of 2003. This data reflects the commitment that my department made last year to begin reporting on this activity on an annual basis. While the total number of requests under routine access policies are significant, I would note that the vast majority of these requests were processed by the Nova Scotia Department of Environment and Labour. It is my understanding that the routine access policies of the vast majority of departments, agencies, boards, and commissions are also readily accessible through each of their web sites.
