I, Marilyn More, Minister of Labour and Advanced Education for the Province of Nova Scotia, pursuant to Section 4 of Chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Building Code Act*, hereby amend the *Nova Scotia Building Code Regulations*, N.S. Reg. ~~36/2011~~ [322/2009], made by Order of the Minister of Labour and ~~Advanced Education~~ [Workforce Development] dated ~~March 4, 2011~~ effective on and after ~~June 1, 2011~~ [November 19, 2009], by adding the following article to those regulations:

- 3.1.1.20.** Subsection 9.7.5. Site-built Windows, Doors and Skylights (Part 9, Division B, Volume 1) of the National Building Code of Canada is amended by striking out the title "Site-built Windows, Doors and Skylights" and substituting the title "Site-built and Other Manufactured Windows, Doors and Skylights"

and this amendment is to come into effect on and after October 1, 2011.
