Personal Health Information Regulations—amendment

Order in Council 2017-265 dated October 31, 2017  
Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council  
pursuant to Section 110 of the *Personal Health Information Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Health and Wellness dated September 13, 2017, and pursuant to Section 110 of Chapter 41 of the Acts of 2010, the *Personal Health Information Act*, is pleased to amend the *Personal Health Information Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 217/2012, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2012-371 dated December 4, 2012, to permit the Nova Scotia Health Authority and the IWK Health Centre to collect, use and disclose personal health information for the purposes of planning and management of health services, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after October 31, 2017.

**Schedule “A”**

**Amendment to the *Personal Health Information Regulations*  
made by the Governor in Council under Section 110 of  
Chapter 41 of the Acts of 2010, the *Personal Health Information Act***

The *Personal Health Information Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 217/2012, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2012-371 dated December 4, 2012, are amended by adding the following Section immediately after Section 5:

**Designation of health authority**

**5A** A health authority as defined in the *Health Authorities Act* is prescribed as being authorized to collect, use and disclose personal health information for the purpose of planning and management of health services as defined in the *Health Authorities Act*.

Correctional Services Regulations—amendment

Order in Council 2017-266 dated October 31, 2017  
Amendment to regulations made by the Minister of Justice  
and approved by the Governor in Council  
pursuant to Section 94 of the *Correctional Services Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Attorney General and Minister of Justice dated September 11, 2017, and pursuant to Section 94 of Chapter 37 of the Acts of 2005, the *Correctional Services Act*, is pleased to approve of amendments made by the Minister of Justice to the *Correctional Services Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 99/2006, made by order of the Minister of Justice dated June 21, 2006, and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2006-317 dated June 28, 2006, to reduce the maximum number of days an offender can be placed in close confinement and to require the superintendent to specify whether a disciplinary penalty is to be imposed concurrently or consecutively in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after October 31, 2017.

I, Mark Furey, Minister of Justice for the Province of Nova Scotia, pursuant to Section 94 of Chapter 37 of the Acts of 2005, the *Correctional Services Act*, hereby amend the *Correctional Services Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 99/2006, made by Order of the Minister of Justice dated June 21, 2006, to reduce the maximum number of days an offender can be placed in close confinement and require a superintendent to specify whether a disciplinary penalty is to be imposed concurrently or consecutively, effective on and after the date this Order is approved by the Governor in Council.

**Amendment to the *Correctional Services Regulations*  
made by the Minister of Justice under Section 94  
of Chapter 37 of the Acts of 2005, the *Correctional Services Act***

- 1 The *Correctional Services Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 99/2006, made by the Minister of Justice and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2016-317 dated June 28, 2006, are amended by repealing subsection 80(4) and substituting the following subsection:
  - (4) If an adult offender remains in close confinement for a continuous period of 10 days, or if an offender who is a young person remains in close confinement for a continuous period of 7 days, the superintendent must request permission from the Executive Director before continuing the close confinement.
- 2 Subsection 95(1) of the regulations is amended by repealing clauses (c) and (d) and substituting the following clauses:
  - (c) close confinement for no longer than 10 days in respect of any one confinement for an adult offender, and for no longer than 7 days in respect of any one confinement for an offender who is a young person;
  - (d) with the approval of the Executive Director, close confinement for longer than 10 days for an adult offender and longer than 7 days for an offender who is a young person;
- 3 Section 95 of the regulations is amended by adding the following subsection immediately following subsection (2):
  - (2A) The superintendent must specify whether a penalty is to be imposed concurrently with or consecutively to any other penalty currently imposed.
