Nova Scotia Child Benefit Regulations—amendment

Order in Council 2025-117 dated April 22, 2025  
Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council  
pursuant to Section 80 of the *Income Tax Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Finance and Treasury Board and the Minister of Opportunities and Social Development dated March 26, 2025, and pursuant to Section 80 of Chapter 217 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Income Tax Act*, is pleased to amend the *Nova*

*Scotia Child Benefit Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 62/1998, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 1998-430 dated August 28, 1998, to establish a bereavement extension for recipients of the Nova Scotia Child Benefit, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after April 22, 2025.

### Schedule “A”

**Amendment to the *Nova Scotia Child Benefit Regulations*  
made by the Governor in Council under Section 80  
of Chapter 217 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,  
the *Income Tax Act***

Section 5 of the *Nova Scotia Child Benefit Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 62/1998, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 1998-430 dated August 28, 1998, is amended by adding the following subsection immediately after subsection (2):

- (2A)** Subsections 122.62(9) and (10) of the Federal Act apply for the purposes of these regulations in respect of the death of a person that occurs after the year 2024.

Reg. 239/1982, made by the Natural Products Marketing Council and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 82-1416 dated November 23, 1982, to implement changes to the Board’s composition and zoning, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after April 22, 2025.

**Amendment to the *Egg Farmers of Nova Scotia Marketing Plan*  
made by the Natural Products Marketing Council under Section 11  
of Chapter 308 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,  
the *Natural Products Act***

- 1 (1) Subsection 8(1) of the *Egg Farmers of Nova Scotia Marketing Plan*, N.S. Reg. 239/1982, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 82-1416 dated November 23, 1982, is repealed and the following subsection is substituted:
  - (1) For the purpose of electing the members of the Board who represent licensed egg producers, the regulated area is divided into the following 2 zones:
    - (a) the Eastern Zone, comprising the counties of Inverness, Richmond, Cape Breton, Victoria, Antigonish, Guysborough, Pictou, Cumberland, Colchester, Halifax and Hants;
    - (b) the Western Zone, comprising the counties of Kings, Annapolis, Lunenburg, Queens, Shelburne, Yarmouth and Digby.
- (2) Clause 8(2)(a) of the regulations is repealed and the following clause is substituted:
  - (a) 2 licensed egg producers elected or appointed by the licensed egg producers in each of the Eastern and Western Zones;
- 2 Section 10 of the regulations is amended by adding the following subsections immediately after subsection (8):
  - (9) A Commodity Board member who assumes office to represent the Central Zone before May 1, 2025, will represent the Eastern Zone on and after May 1, 2025, for the remainder of their term of office, and a member who represents the Eastern Zone before May 1, 2025, continues to represent that zone for the remainder of their term of office.
  - (10) A Commodity Board member who assumes office to represent the Southern Zone before May 1, 2025, will represent the Western Zone on and after May 1, 2025, for the remainder of their term of office, and a member who represents the Western Zone before May 1, 2025, continues to represent that zone for the remainder of their term of office.
