
The Board approves the application and orders that:


1. The number of polling districts for the Municipality is set at 11;

4. All provisions of the *Municipal Government Act* and the *Municipal Elections Act* and any other Acts of the Province of Nova Scotia applying to the preparation for and holding of the regular election of councillors of the Municipality in the year 2028 will be complied with as if the above-noted changes had been made on the first day of March 2028, but for all other purposes, such changes shall take effect on the first day of the first meeting of the Council after the election of councillors for the year 2028.






Schedule A - Maps of Districts






