Owners of Regulated Equipment must:

- 1. Ensure all regulated equipment has a valid equipment licence.
- 2. Ensure that all regulated plants are staffed and properly maintained under the Power Engineers Regulations.
- 3. Report all accidents resulting in injury or damage to pressure vessels within 24 hours.

Operators (and Chief Engineers) of Regulated Equipment must:

- 1. Maintain and operate regulated equipment as required under the Act, Regulations and Codes.
- 2. Have a valid licence for the plant where they are employed.
- 3. Follow the duties and responsibilities as outlined in the Power Engineers Regulations.

Contractors Working on Regulated Equipment must:

- 1. Have a valid Boiler and Pressure Equipment Contractor Licence to preform work on regulated equipment.
- 2. Be or hire appropriately qualified and licensed welders.
- 3. Follow applicable codes and regulations when preforming such regulated work.
- 4. Inform the owner of any safety concerns for operation of regulated equipment.
