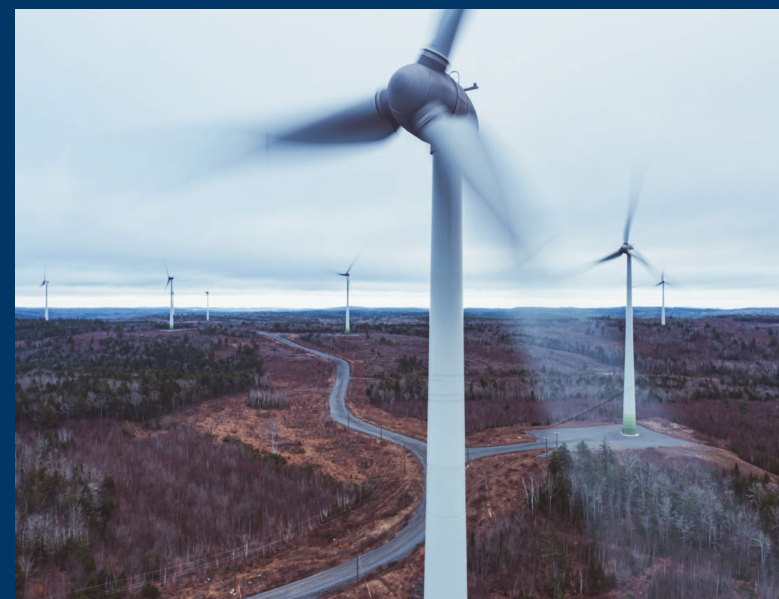

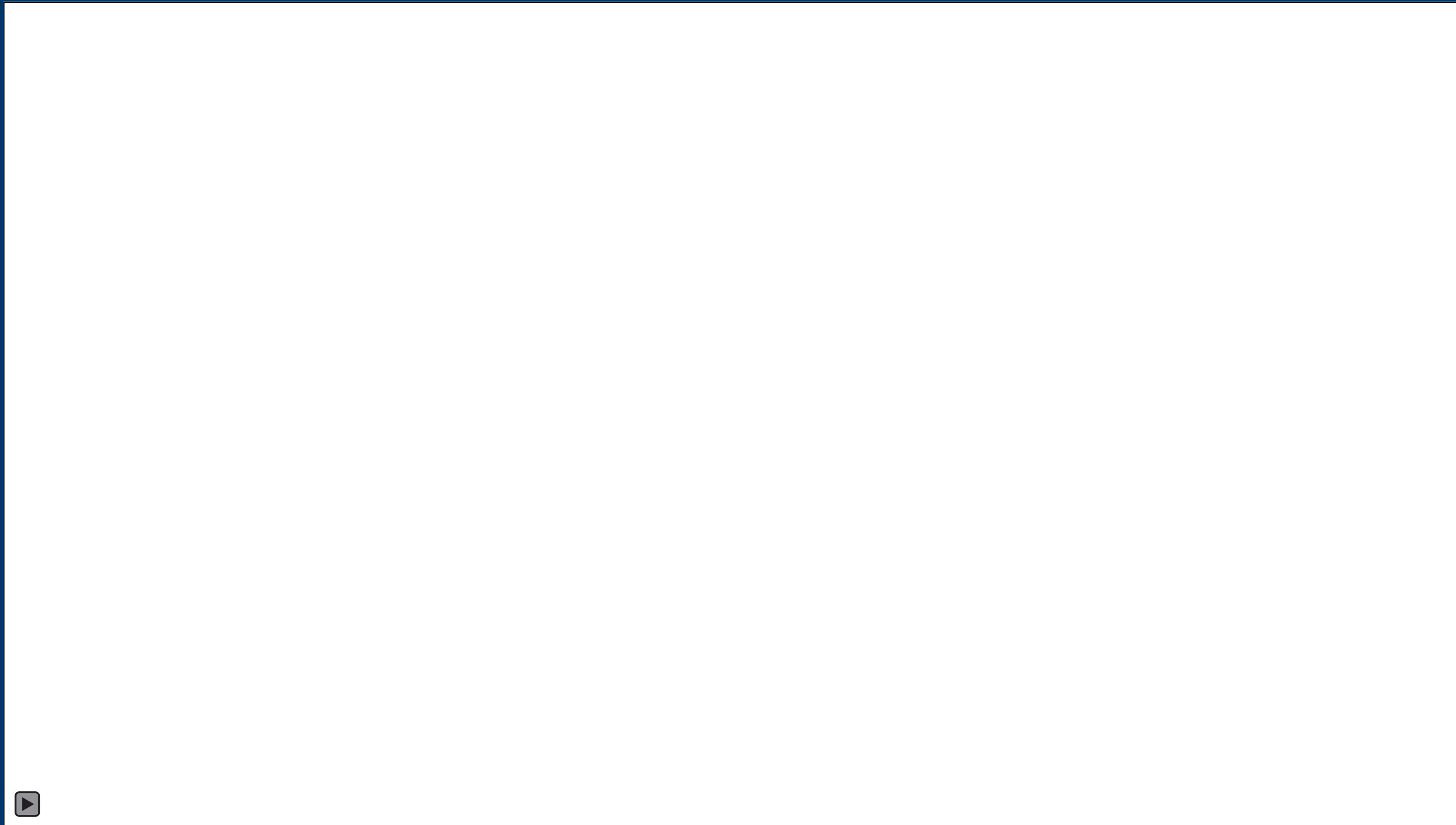

# What is CBA?

- **The CBA system is an online system used to report experience.**
- **CBA will replace the current method (Board of Examiners and Mentor experience reviews) used to assess experience for applicants and EITs.**
- **The 48 month work experience, including at least 12 months in a Canadian environment requirements will not change.**



# 34 Competencies

- **The 34 competencies and their indicators are detailed on this website:**

- **They fall within 7 categories**
  - **Technical Competence**
  - **Communication**
  - **Project & Financial Management**
  - **Team Effectiveness**
  - **Professional Accountability**
  - **Social, Economic, Environmental, and Sustainability**
  - **Personal Continuing Professional Development**



# What is the process?



- **Self-Assessment:** applicants begin by providing examples from their own experience for each of the 34 competencies and self-evaluating their performance against the rating scale.
- **Submission:** Applicants can submit documentation online in support of a particular competency; this supporting documentation will only be required if an assessor requires proof of that specific competency.
- **Validation:** Individuals nominated by the applicant who are familiar with the applicant's work validate their competencies and experience and provide their rating.
- **Evaluation:** Assessors review submitted materials and rate each of the competencies.
- **Feedback and Development:** Applicants receive feedback and may need to revise their submissions or acquire additional experience within the competencies based on the CBA results.

# Roles: Who's Who?



- **Applicants:** Individuals applying for registration as a professional engineer (P. Eng.) or engineering licensee (Eng. L.)
- **Validators:** Individuals who have first-hand, professional knowledge of the applicant's work (usually a supervisor or colleague)
- **Assessors:** Anyone who conducts competency assessments (usually a professional engineer)

# Mentor Program Transition Tiers



Approved Experience as of December 31, 2026	Required Competencies
12 months or less	Must report on 34 competencies
>12 months ; <24 months	Must report on 26 competencies
>24 months ; <36 months	Must report on 19 competencies
>36 months ; <48 months	Must report on 8 competencies

**These tiers were established using the existing work experience requirements, professional accountability and Canadian environment considerations, and the progression of an engineer throughout their career.**

**The requirement to complete the remainder of the 48 months of experience does not change with the introduction of CBA.**



# Timelines



- **October 1 – November 30, 2024**
  - Pre-pilot program training for assessors using sample applicants.
- **January 1 – June 30, 2025**
  - Pilot program launch with select NS applicants, assessors, and validators.
  - Volunteer applicants and EITs are required for the pilot program.
- **July 1, 2025**
  - All new applicants using the CBA instead of the Mentor Program.
- **December 31, 2026**
  - Experience assessments through the Mentor Program ends, detailed experience records no longer accepted.
