We want to ensure that everyone involved understands our legislation, codes, and standards. We offer presentations and programs to educate and inform. We want everyone to see the benefits of each rule


and to know how to comply.

We consider several factors when setting our inspection frequency for equipment, workplaces, and public spaces: risk-level; safety maturity of sector/industry; history of compliance.

Enforcing Requirements

We encourage voluntary compliance.
