

INSTRUCTION SHEET

Complaint Concerning a Jurisdictional Dispute (Trade Union Act, Section 52)

This form can be used to request that the Labour Board issue an interim order directing the assignment of work to prevent a work stoppage resulting from a jurisdictional dispute. If your complaint does not relate to a jurisdictional dispute, use TUA s.51 form.

By filing this complaint, the complainant claims that:

- They have reasonable grounds to believe that a work stoppage is likely to occur as a result of a jurisdictional dispute between trade unions.

Important to note:

- Do not modify this form.
- This form must be completed in its entirety and properly signed before the application will be processed.
- Applications may be delivered by email, personal service, or by registered mail or other similar mail services.
- If an application is filed on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, it will be deemed to be filed on the following business day, as set out in the *Trade Union Act General Regulations*.
- The authority to issue an interim order is covered by Sections 50 and 52 of the *Trade Union Act*.
- This Application applies to Part 2 of the Act
- If a work stoppage occurs because of a concern raised about workplace safety, the appropriate venue for expressing concern and seeking help is the Occupational Health and Safety Division of the Department of Labour, Skills and Immigration.
