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NOVA SCOTIA REGISTRY OF BUYERS SUMMARY - 2005

The total provincial harvest for 2005 is reported to be 6 254 716 cubic metres of solid wood. Of this amount, 89% or 5 594 592 cubic metres were softwood species. The total volume of wood exported was reported to be 1 046 220 cubic metres, or 17% of the total harvest.

The provincial harvest for 2005 shows a decrease of 9.2 % when compared to the 2004 harvest of 6 888 524 cubic metres.

Statistical returns were received from 319 Registered Buyers. Data was estimated for 2 non-compliant buyers, for a total of 321 Registered Buyers. Of the 321 buyers, 227 were reported to be active in the 2005 calendar year.

NOTE: The volume of firewood harvest included in this report reflects only the amount harvested by commercial firewood producers acquiring more than 1000 cubic metres annually. In 2004 Natural Resources Canada conducted a survey and reported the quantity of wood used as a household energy source. The Natural Resources Canada report, entitled "Survey Of Household Energy Use – 2003", indicates that as much as 450 000 cubic metres of wood may be used as a household energy source on an annual basis in Nova Scotia.

By Business Class (321 Buyers)

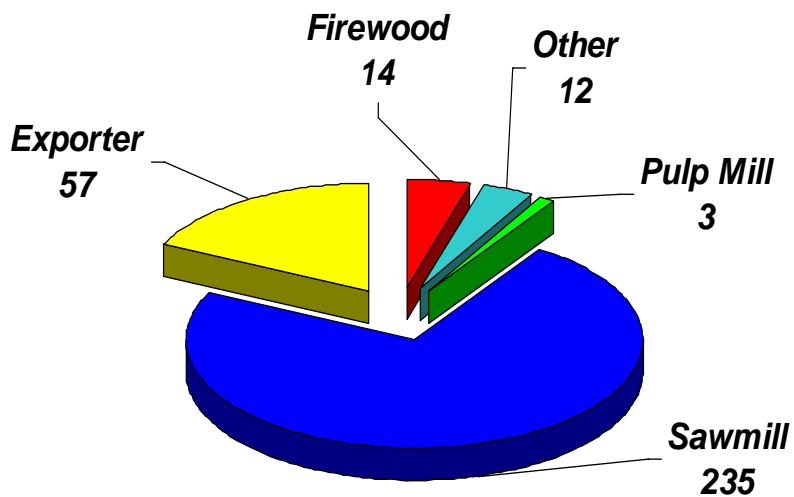

By Acquisition Class (321 Buyers)

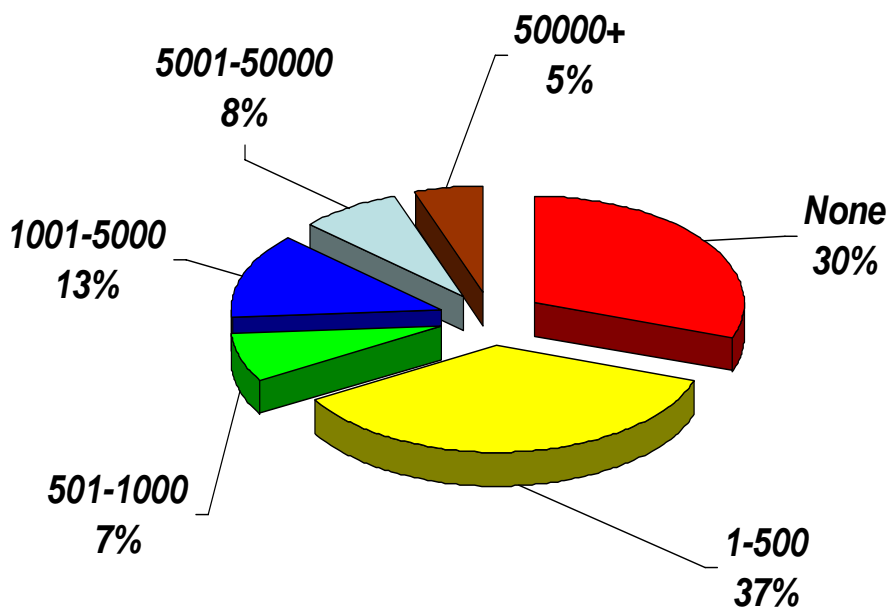

WOOD ACQUISITION PLAN PROGRAM - 2005

Summary

The Wood Acquisition Plan (W.A.P.) Program required by the Forest Sustainability Regulations completed the sixth year of operation in 2005. All Registered Buyers that acquired greater than 5,000 m³ from privately owned forest lands in Nova Scotia during the 2005 calendar year were required to submit a Wood Acquisition Plan for that volume in 2006. Most compliant Registered Buyers opted for undertaking a silviculture program for the year 2005, and submitted a summary of completed silviculture (Form D, Part III) for claim in 2005 along with supporting silviculture site location details.

The volumes from 2005 that required a Wood Acquisition Plan totaled 5.313 million cubic metres (Table 1). From those volumes, a total of 14.635 million silviculture credit value was required in year 2005, and the summary reports indicated that 18.530 million silviculture credits were claimed, which included 16.667 million silviculture credits and 1.85 million administrative credits (Table 1).

In addition to claimed silviculture credits, Registered Buyers contributed 31,018 dollars to the Sustainable Forestry Fund in 2005.

Industrial silviculture credits exceeded credits required in 2005 (Table 1) by 2.3 million. Private silviculture credits exceeded credits required by 1.57 million.

A total of 35,215 hectares of silviculture for a credit value of 16.677 million were claimed in 2005 (Table 2). Early Competition Control (Category 3) recorded the most area claimed at 32.1% which accounted for 20.4% of the total credit value (Table 2). Established Plantation (Category 2) recorded 30.8% in area but accounted for 42.3 % of total credit value claimed in 2005 (Table 2). Categories 4 and 5 combined had approximately 25% of claimed area. Category 1 had 8.5% of the claimed area while Categories 6 and 7 accounted for 3.6% of area claimed in 2005 (Table 2). Softwood silviculture completed on all lands was 98 % of the total credit value claimed in year 2005 (Table 3).

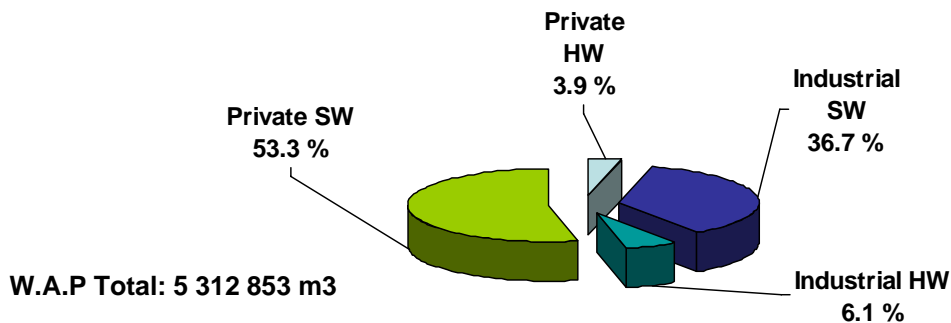
A breakdown of completed silviculture by category and ownership is described in Table 4. Private silviculture value claimed in the Wood Acquisition Plans for 2005 totaled 9.137 million credits (Table 4). Industrial silviculture claimed through Wood Acquisition Plans for year 2005 totaled 7.541 million credits (Table 4).

A summary of completed silviculture area claimed in year 2005 by silviculture category, ownership and species type is included in Table 5.

W.A.P. Silviculture - 2005**

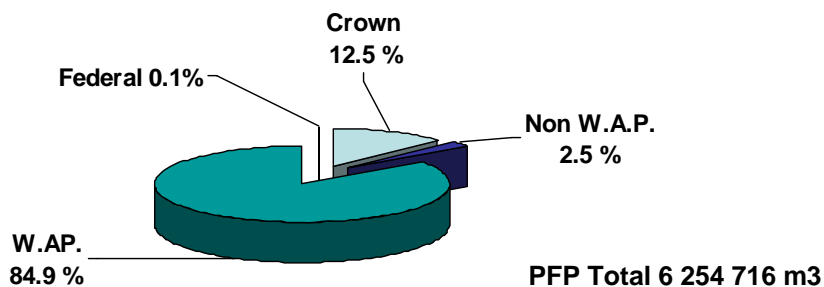
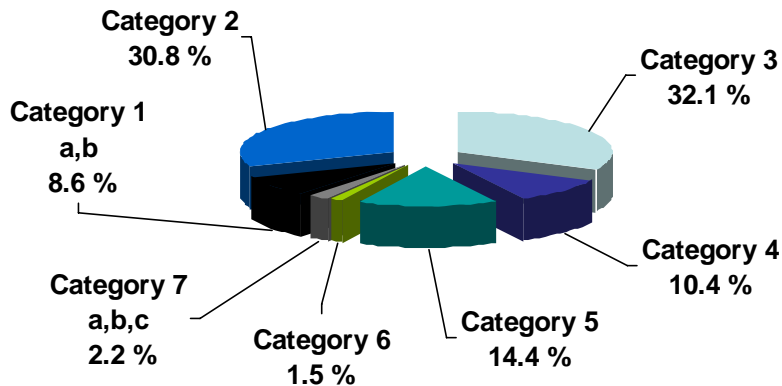

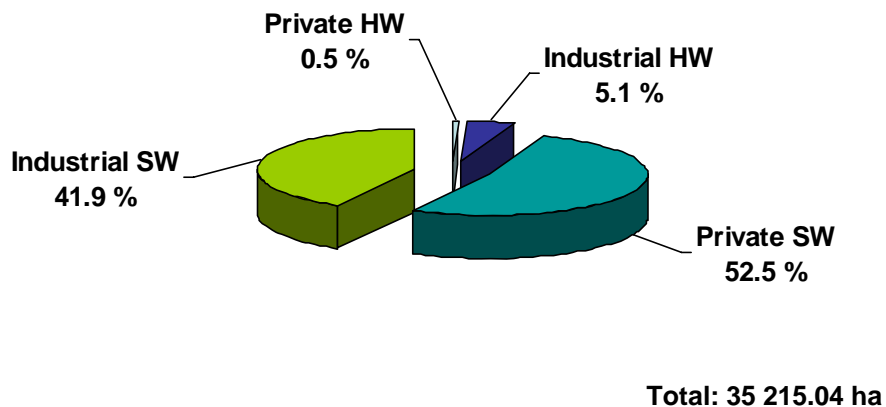
