

A Brief Overview of Groundwater Resources in Nova Scotia

Use of groundwater as a resource depends on knowledge of the available quantity and quality, the ability to develop it in a cost-effective manner, constraints to its development, the ability to manage it in a sustainable manner, and the ability to protect it over both the short- and long-terms. A brief overview will be given of one aspect of the above, specifically groundwater quantity and quality, in relation to broad regional hydro-stratigraphic units in Nova Scotia.
