Supply is still unpredictable and fluctuations are common. Supply is confirmed two weeks in advance and that is why appointments are only booked two weeks in advance.

In March, 81,000 doses will be received in the last week.

All predictions about when people will get vaccinated are based on receiving the amount of vaccine expected from the federal government.

Vaccine stats (to end of day March 22)

119,110 doses received to date:

- 60,660 doses in arms
- 21,856 second doses held in freezers (used by April 2)
- 36,594 doses being used at clinics this week

Clinics running this week:

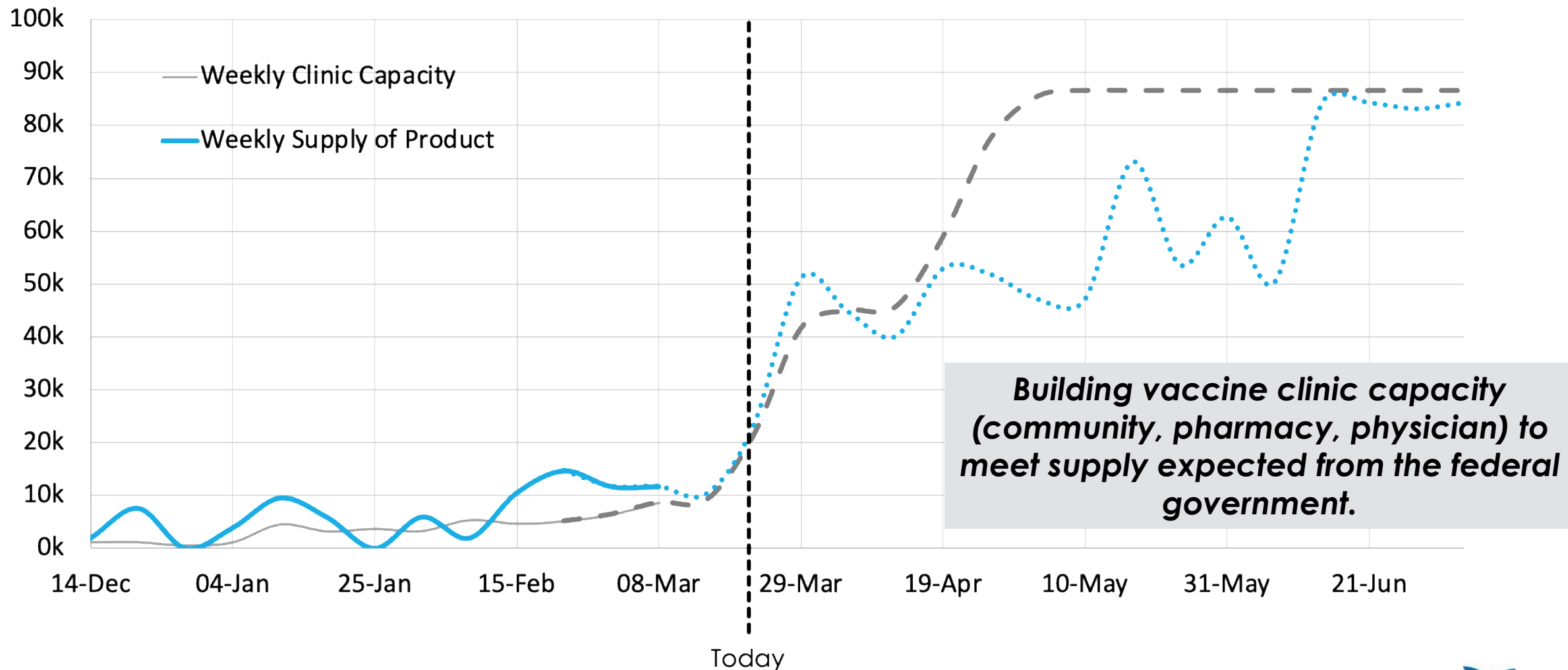
- 31 LTC facilities
- 6 HCW
- 10 community clinics
- 25 AZ clinics
- 2 First Nations clinics

Phase 1 Progress Update

- Those who work directly with patients in hospital or in home (e.g. nurses, paramedic, homecare) ~ 24,000 people
- Those who live and/or work in group settings (e.g. licensed long-term care, residential care) ~ 40,000 people
- Nova Scotians aged 80 and older ~ 48,000 people
- Those at increased risk including First Nations, African Nova Scotians, shelter residents and staff – work being done with communities to identify participants
- ~ 50% done – on track to be complete by end of April

Weekly Supply of Vaccine and Clinic Capacity

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Models of Delivery

By mid-May:

- All clinics running at full capacity
- Able to deliver 86,000 doses per week

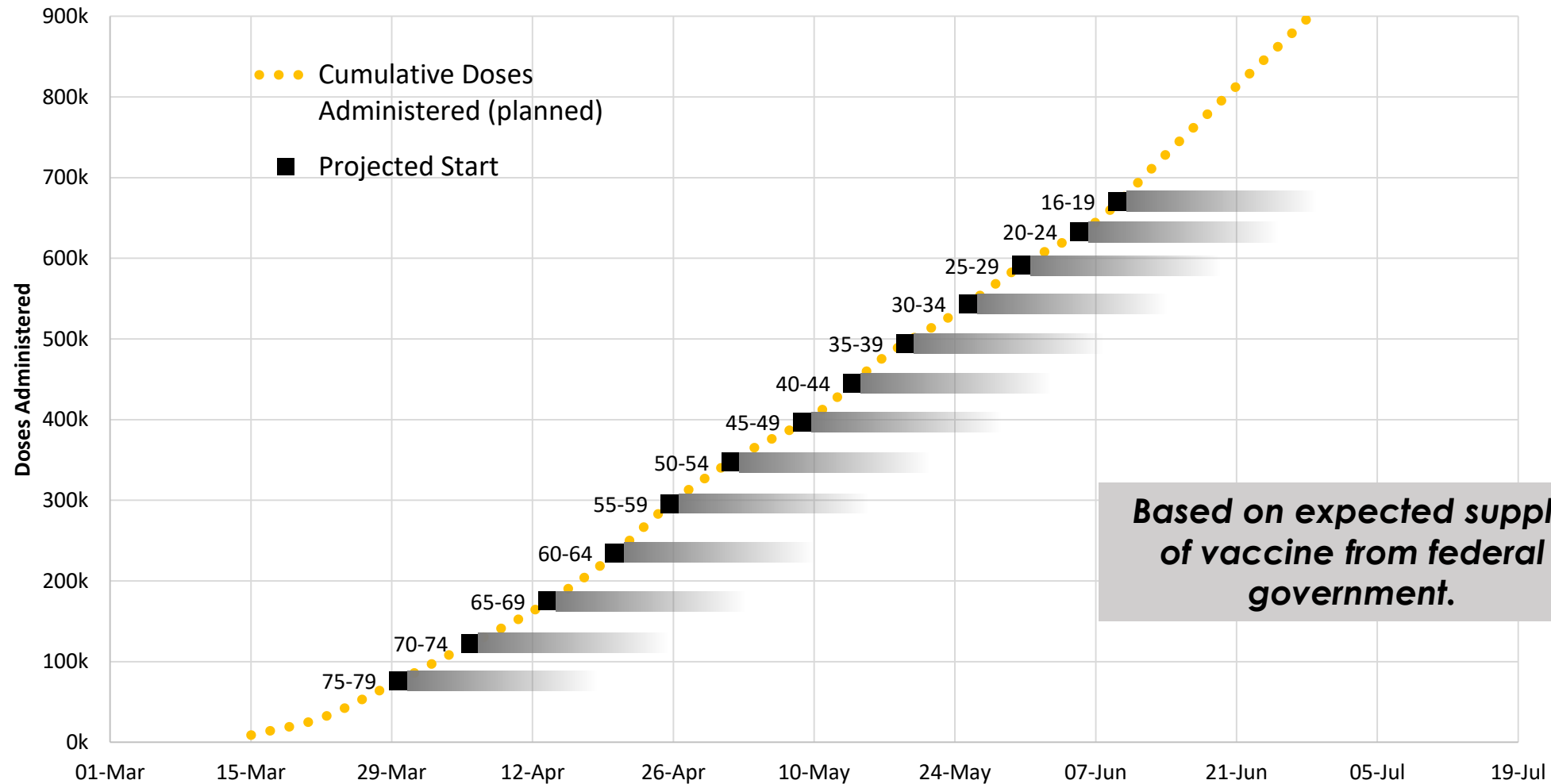
Delivery models:

- Pharmacy/Primary Care Clinics – 70%
- Community Clinics – 29%
- Outreach/mobile clinics – 1%

Healthcare worker clinics and long-term care clinics are on target to be completed by end of April.

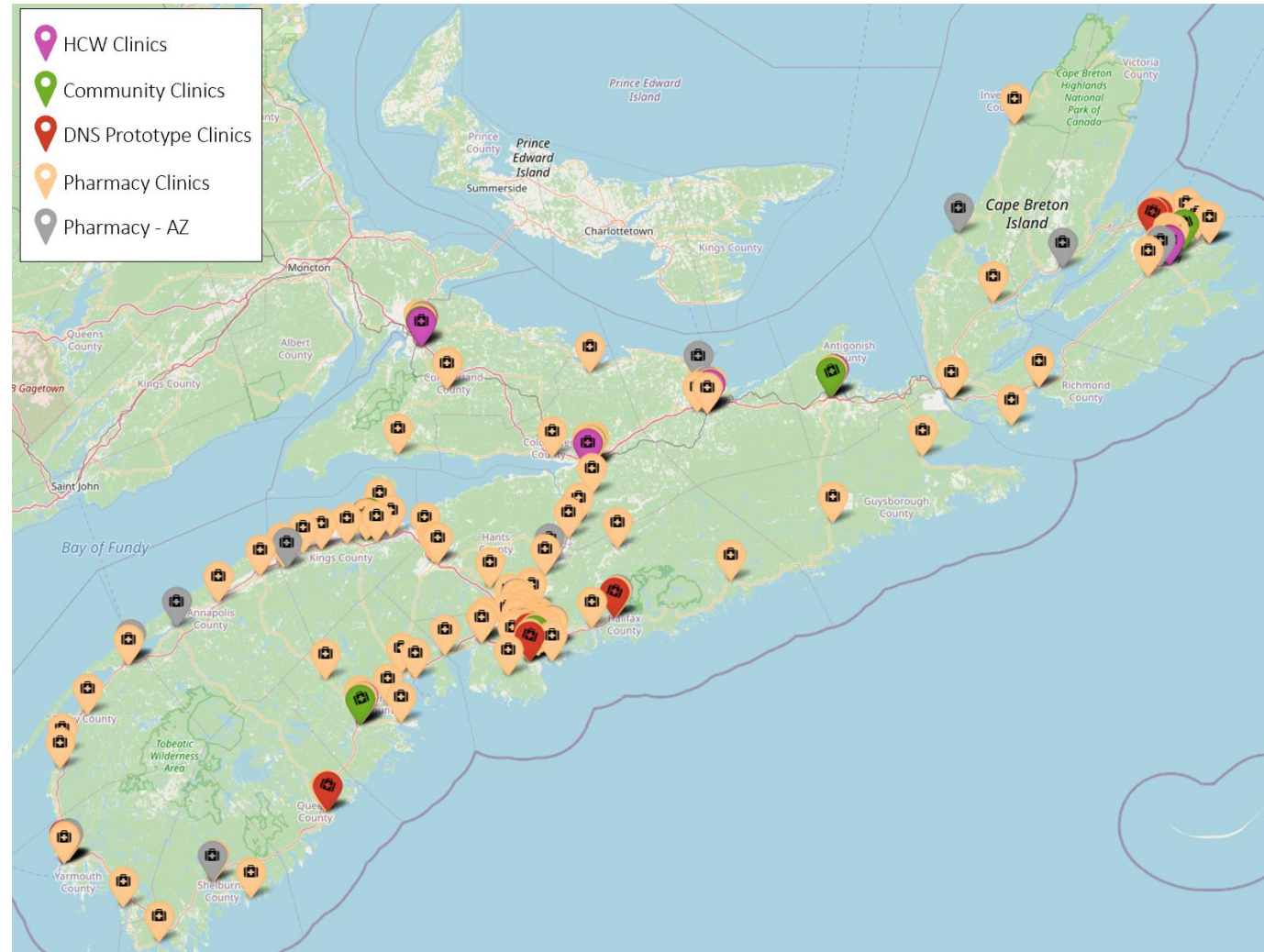
Projected Dates by Age Group – First Dose
