## Registration of Undertaking for Environmental Assessment ENVIRONMENT ACT

This is to advise that on May 9, 2023, Nova Scotia Department of Public Works registered the Highway 101 Cambridge Interchange and Connector Road Project for environmental assessment, in accordance with Part IV of the Environment Act.

The proposed Project involves the construction, maintenance and post-construction monitoring of a new interchange along Highway 101, with two new connector roads; one south to Trunk 1 and one north to Brooklyn Street. The new interchange is located between Coldbrook (Exit 14) and Berwick (Exit 15), near the Annapolis Valley First Nation (AVFN) Reserve. The south connector road travels 2-kilometers to Trunk 1 near Waterville Mountain Road, and the north connector travels 1.5-kilometers to Brooklyn Street. The connector roads are designed as two-lane roads, with additional turning lanes at high volume accesses as necessary.

The Project construction may commence in late 2023 and is expected to be completed within 5 years.
