## Overview

Located in Eastern Passage overlooking Halifax Harbour, this park offers an extensive boardwalk that provides coastal walking opportunities and beautiful views of McNabs and Lawlor Islands Provincial Park

## Protection Values

One species of bird found at the park has been classed as being critically imperiled.

Designated under Beaches Act

## Education Values

Potential for interpretation of natural and cultural setting (McNabs and Lawlor Islands Provincial Park, adjacent fishing village)

## Tourism Values

Complements local tourism infrastructure; very popular walking trail serving primarily local residents

## Outdoor Recreation Values

Walking, beach access, picnicking, fishing

## Other Site Considerations

Susceptible to coastal processes (storm events with high tide surge or wind driven waves) that cause site erosion.

Parking lot includes an agreement for use by Fishermans Cove visitors
