Overview

A provincially-significant coastal system with over 9 kilometres of beach on St. Georges Bay. One of the best examples of dune succession in Nova Scotia.

Protection Values

Site of Ecological Significance; two species of vascular plants and one species of bird found at the park are considered critically imperilled. There is also one species of vascular plant and one species of bird classed as imperilled and one species of bird classed as vulnerable to extirpation or extinction; one of a few beaches in Nova Scotia with a range of successional forests. Pomquet and Dunns beaches have been identified as Patch # 319 and Patch # 527, respectively, that could contribute to the Province's goal of protecting 12% of the land base by 2015. Designated under the Beaches Act.

Education Values

Regionally significant potential for a range of interpretive themes – coastal processes, unique ecosystems, wildlife habitat, landscapes, interpretive panels. The Delorey property at Monks Head features Acadian Culture.

Tourism Values

Regionally significant; one of a number of high quality beach parks along St. Georges Bay; offers picnicking, beach access, swimming, walking, potential for ecotourism, close to 100 series highway, potential for partnerships.

Walking trail, high quality supervised beach, limited picnicking, beach walking, cross-country skiing, fishing, beach volleyball tournament, birding
