Overview

A popular picnic park with white sand beach on the Gulf of St. Lawrence

Protection Values

Small land base; Protected Beach (designated under Beaches Act). One species of bird found at the park is listed as critically imperiled. This park is identified by the N.S. Department of Environment as a property (Patch # 551) that could contribute to the Province's goal of protecting 12% of the land base by 2015. Includes a rare dune slack system.

Tourism Values

Regionally significant; one of the warmest beaches in Nova Scotia and one of the few public beaches on Cape Breton's Gulf of St. Lawrence

Existing walking trail with potential for expansion; high quality beach, swimming, carry-in boat opportunity, picnicking, birding offers beach access, swimming, picnicking, trail
